

Cinde Warmington Announces Campaign for Executive Council

Health care professional, attorney, and Democratic activist seeks District 2 seat

Nov. 21, 2019 (Concord, N.H.) -- Today, health care professional and attorney, Cinde Warmington, announced her campaign for the District 2 Executive Council seat. Cinde released the following statement announcing her candidacy:

"I am running because the people of this District deserve an Executive Councilor with a proven track record of fighting for our shared values. In this race, the stakes have never been higher. Reproductive rights, workers' rights, voting rights, and LGBTQ+ rights are all in jeopardy. Health care, education, the environment, and economic justice are on the ballot.
