Recap: Why the CPSM Study?

- New Interlocal Agreement (ILA) with PBCFR effective 10/1/23, with a 10year term (current ILA sunsets on 9/30/23).
- PBCFR's changing cost methodology during the negotiations for the new ILA drove the Town to analyze the fiscal sustainability of an increasing Fire & EMS MSTU over the long term.
- CPSM was contracted to explore the feasibility of Fire & EMS service delivery opportunities and options that may be available to the Town, to include a Town Fire Rescue Department.

Cost Differences Between the Old and New ILA (FY23 to FY24)

- No maximums on equipment and personnel.
- Added cost of move-ups, with no maximum.
 - Move-ups are defined as when a Jupiter unit is required to assist in another, non-Jupiter area, and other units are moved-in to back-fill and support.
- Added cost of non-budgeted situations, up to \$400,000 annually.
- Added cost of station renovations and repairs in excess of \$200,000, up to \$400,000 per project, per station.
- Added cost of new stations, based on the percentage of calls in the area the station serves that are Jupiter in the first year of service.

- Same overall (or enhanced) level of service, with local control over operations and cost.
- Same level of service for EMS.
- Addition of ladder truck and relevant personnel specific to Jupiter to provide increased level of service
 (personnel and equipment) for Fire (current PBCFR ILA calls for ladder truck to be brought in when needed).


