## RULING ON MATTER UNDER ADVISEMENT

The issue of transfer has been under advisement. The Court relates as follows to the factors set forth in Juvenile Rule 14.

- 1. Both offenses are extremely serious and carry mandatory prison sentences. They were committed in an aggressive, violent, obviously premeditated and willful manner.
- 2. Both offenses were against the person of a fourteen year old girl and resulted in injury, personal and emotional, to her.
- 3. The juvenile will become eighteen on March 7, 1989 and there are over twenty-five (25) months remaining of juvenile jurisdiction. The other items in factor (3) are adequately set forth in the Transfer Summary of January 6, 1987 and it is therefore incorporated herein by reference.
- 4. There are no known physical disabilities. The juvenile is not mentally deficient, defective, retarded or ill and therefore not committable.
- 5. This is the juvenile's first referral so far as is known. It is rather difficult to understand this, however, based upon the social and emotional and behavioral background of this juvenile. His contact with the enforcement aspects of the juvenile system is limited to the present offense. However, he has had extensive counseling, including hospitalization, for his behavior in Georgia.

- 6. The juvenile has not been previously transferred.
- The juvenile is very bright and should be advanced academically. He is behaviorly and emotionally dangerous. He is extremely touchy and defensive and gets others extremely angry at him. He is extremely self-centered with high levels of anti-social personality functioning and likely continuing aggressive behaviors toward others in the future. He is diagnosed as having a Conduct Disorder, Undersocialized Aggressive Type with Anti-Social Personality Characteristics and Narcissistic Personality Characteristics. The psychological estimate of a moderate to moderately high acting out potential is a gross understatement. At less than the age of 9, this juvenile was impulsive, explosive, and preoccupied with sexual content. He has not changed. He has been unabatedly aggressive to others and destructive of property since nursery school. He destroys his own clothing, personal possessions and pets apparently on whim and caprice. Approximately six years of intervention in fifteen years of life have resulted in abysmal failure. Twenty-five months of the most intensive and expensive professional intervention, short of God's, will provide no protection for the public and no rehabilitation of this juvenile by any services or facilities presently available to the Juvenile Court.

Based on the foregoing, the Court determines that the public safety and the public interest would best be served by the pransfer of the juvenile for criminal prosecution.

ORDERED granting the State's request and directing that Todd Christopher Kohlhepp be transferred to the appropriate adult court for criminal prosecution on the Petition filed November 26, 1986.

ORDERED that the juvenile be detained no more than 24 hours pending his transfer of custody to the appropriate law enforcement agency.

ORDERED that upon transfer the responsibility of the Maricopa County Juvenile Court Center ends subject to the applicable provisions of the Arizona Revised Statutes.
