

## Media Fact Sheet

### **University Hospital Patient Update:**

- 12 patients were admitted to UNMH in total
  - Of those one died shortly after arrival
  - One was discharged
  - This brings our current patient count from this incident to ten (10)
    - Of those we have three (3) adults who are in intensive care
      - One is critical – two are serious
    - We have two (2) children who are also in neonatal intensive care.
    - We have three patients in medical surgical beds – one (1) is serious and two (2) are satisfactory
    - One (1) in a pediatric bed
    - One (1) more patient is expected to be discharged soon

The University of New Mexico Hospital is the state's only academic medical center. It serves as the primary teaching hospital for the UNM School of Medicine, meeting the urgent and complex medical needs of a diverse population. UNMH is home to New Mexico's only Level I trauma center and provides advanced pediatric, burn care, stroke and neurosurgical services, as well as other specialties.

### **2018 – UNMH Mass Casualty Incidents**

- 22 declared MCI's (definition is 3 or more transported to a hospital) since Jan. Large scale/notable MCIs are noted below:
  - 7-15 Sandoval County MCI Bus Crash
  - 6-20 Valencia County motor vehicle crash
  - 6-3 Valencia County motor vehicle crash
  - 5-3 550 and Chayote Rd 5 car motor vehicle crash
  - 4-16 Sandoval Star Lake Area motor vehicle crash
- We have also conducted five (5) full scale exercises with sister agencies across the state this year ranging from active shooter incidents to terrorist attacks.
