FIRST QUARTER REVIEW

January 1—March 31, 2021-2023

Part I Crime

In 2023 compared to 2022:

- Part I crimes have decreased 19% (5,874) from (7,252)
- Homicides decreased 22% (39) from (50)
- Property crime decreased 24%
- Auto thefts decreased 34% (1,433) from (2,175)

Crash Data

In 2023 compared to 2022:

- Crashes decreased 11% (3,426) from (3,855)
- Hit and run crashes decreased 19% (1,261) from (1,550)

There were 16 fatalities for the first quarter in both 2022 and 2023.

Clearance Rates

In 2023, the homicide clearance rate is 74%.

Data Methods: Part I crime data was obtained from the DCS Fact table and counts distinct incidents (with the exception of rape, aggravated assault and human trafficking which count victims) for the time period of January 1—March 31, 2021-2023. Homicide and non-fatal shooting data was obtained from the respective OMAP Homicide and Non-Fatal Shooting databases and counts victims for the same time period above. Carjacking data was obtained from the OMAP Carjacking database and counts distinct incidents for the same time period above. Crash data was obtained from TraCS 10 and counts distinct crashes for the same time period above. Fatal crash data was obtained from OMAP Fatal Crash database and counts victims for the same time period above. UCR Homicide clearances were obtained from the Homicide Division and reflects homicides cleared by arrest or exceptional means and includes clearances of prior year homicides.
