




Within Persons Crimes, how do Violent Crimes compare to other Persons Crimes?







POLICE REPORTS – 10 YEARS OF INDEX CRIMES*




Index Crimes were -22% below the 10-year average

*Index Crimes as defined by the FBI comprise murder and non-negligent manslaughter, robbery, forcible rape, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny (including shoplifting), motor vehicle theft, and arson



2025 DENSITY OF INDEX CRIMES




Approximately 83% of our Index Crimes were Property Crimes. 21% of Index Crimes were Shoplifting, 15% were Theft from Vehicle, and 15% were Burglary. 70% of Theft from Vehicle and 49% of Burglary reports were coded for no signs of force.

The area near the Dorman Center off W O Ezell Blvd & E Blackstock Rd had the highest density.




POLICE REPORTS – 10 YEARS OF CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY



Property crimes were -25% below the 10-year average



2025 DENSITY OF CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY




Approximately 25% of property crimes were Shoplifting, 19% were Theft from Motor Vehicle, and 18% were Burglaries.

The area near the Dorman Center off W O Ezell Blvd & E Blackstock Rd had the highest density.



POLICE REPORTS – 10 YEARS OF VIOLENT CRIMES




Violent crime incidents were -2% below the 10-year average

*Violent crimes are defined as murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault



2025 DENSITY OF VIOLENT CRIMES




Approximately 76% of Violent Crimes were Aggravated Assaults. Of these, 57% involved or alleged involvement of a firearm, and 21% involved domestic violence or child abuse/neglect.

The areas near the intersections of Crescent Ave & Pineneedle Dr, Wofford St & Arch St, and Dr OC Kirkland Ter & Rev Booker T Sears St had the highest density.




CALLS FOR SERVICE – 5 YEARS OF ACCIDENT CALLS

CALLS FOR SERVICE – 5 YEARS OF PSYCHOLOGICAL CALLS




Psychological call types were +5% above the 5-year average

CALLS FOR SERVICE – 5 YEARS OF HOMELESS CALLS




Calls for “homeless” were +31% above the 5-year average

*Drug related & Overdose call types accounted for >1% of calls with “homeless” in the comments for all 5 years





2025 vs. 2024 POLICE REPORTS – STOLEN FIREARMS




2025: Of 89 firearms stolen with or from a vehicle, 56 (63%) showed **no signs of force.**







2025 BENCHMARK OFFENSES CLEARED BY JUVENILE CUSTODY vs 2024






2025 BENCHMARK OFFENSES CLEARED BY ADULT ARREST vs 2024

POLICING IN PARTNERSHIP: SMALL EFFORTS, LARGE IMPACTS



Secure your vehicles, houses, and firearms.

There were no signs of force in 70% of Theft from Vehicle reports, 49% of Burglary reports, and for 63% of firearms stolen from/with a vehicle. It's like securing food at campsites; if everyone does it, bears are less likely to visit the campgrounds.



Plan Ahead.

Smart911 allows you to share the information you want first responders to know, such as medical conditions or emergency contact phone numbers, in an emergency. When you sign up for Smart911, first responders will be aware of important information you have provided that will help Police, Fire, and EMS locate and help you in an emergency.
