OPENING DAY SUCCESS UNDER SABAN: Alabama has been dominant in season openers under head coach Nick Saban. The Tide is a perfect 13-0 under Saban and has won in impressive fashion. Alabama has outscored its opponents 528-144 in those games and has outgained the opposition, 5,743-2,685. The Tide has averaged 40.6 points per opening contest under Saban and given up just 11.1 points per game. UA has also amassed 441.8 total yards per opener and surrendered just 206.5 yards per matchup.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Alabama will begin the 2020 season on the road against Missouri. It will be the first time the Crimson Tide has begun a season with a true road game since 2000 when UA traveled west to take on UCLA on Sept. 2 of that year. The Bruins handed the Crimson Tide a 35-24 loss in that matchup. Saturday's contest with the Tigers will also be the first time Alabama has begun its season on the road against a conference opponent since 1999 when the Tide squared off with Vanderbilt, a 28-17 win for UA. Overall, Alabama is 16-11-1 when beginning its season with a true road matchup, including a 12-3 mark over its last 15 games.

SABAN'S ROAD RECORD: Head coach Nick Saban owns a 74-32-1 (.696) mark in road games across his four career stops, including a 46-9 (.836) mark while at Alabama. Saban has notched seven perfect road records (2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2018) and has lost more than one game on the road in only two seasons (2007, 2010). Alabama has also won 32 of its last 36 road games dating back to the 2011 campaign.

SABAN IN SEC ROAD GAMES: Head coach Nick Saban owns a 56-16 (.778) mark in SEC road games across his time at LSU and Alabama, including a 44-8 (.846) mark with the Crimson Tide. Saban has notched eight perfect SEC road seasons (2003, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2018).

SABAN IN SEC ROAD OPENERS: Nick Saban is 12-1 (.923) in SEC road openers since he arrived in 2007, with the lone loss coming at Ole Miss in 2014. Counting his time at LSU, Saban is 14-4 (.778) in the opening road game of SEC play in his previous 18 SEC seasons. Saban is also 9-0 at Alabama when the Tide's first Southeastern Conference game of the season is on the road.

EASTERN STREAK: Alabama's 35-13 home win over Tennessee on Oct. 19 of last season was the Crimson Tide's 26th consecutive victory over an SEC Eastern Division opponent, dating back to a 35-21 loss at then-No. 19 South Carolina on Oct. 9, 2010. The 26 wins include a 5-0 record in SEC Championship Games. During the current run, the Tide is 10-0 vs. Tennessee; 4-0 vs. Florida (2-0 in SEC CG) and Georgia (2-0 in SEC CG, 1-0 in CFP NCG); 3-0 vs. Missouri (1-0 in SEC CG); 2-0 vs. Kentucky and Vanderbilt; and 1-0 vs. South Carolina. Overall, under Nick Saban the Crimson Tide is 36-3 (.923) against the SEC East, including a 6-1 (.857) record in the SEC Championship Game.

UNRANKED, NO PROBLEM UNDER SABAN: With its 66-3 win against Western Carolina on Nov. 23, 2019, Alabama has defeated 91 consecutive unranked teams under head coach Nick Saban, the longest streak in FBS history. The current streak began with a win over Colorado on December 30, 2007 in the Independence Bowl. The previous record was 72 games, shared by Miami (Fla.) (1984-95) and Florida (1989-2000). Under Saban, Alabama holds a 95-3 (.969) (91-3, .968 after vacations) mark against unranked opponents.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL: Alabama's No. 3 ranking in this week's Associated Press Top 25 Poll marks the 199th consecutive week that the Crimson Tide has appeared in the poll. That streak is the longest active streak in college football. The 199 weeks more than doubles second-place Clemson with the Tigers appearing in the poll for 88 consecutive weeks. Ohio State previously held the second-longest streak behind the Crimson Tide but did not appear in the Week 2 iteration of the poll. Prior to their absence, the Buckeyes had appeared in the AP rankings for 132 straight weeks. Alabama's 199 straight weeks tops the Crimson Tide's previous program-long streak of 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings in the mid-1990s.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in 141 of 144 regular season games that have had national championship implications. Following the Crimson Tide's 48-45 loss to Auburn during the final regular game of the season in 2019, UA was essentially eliminated from a chance to keep itself in the national championship discussion. The final three games of the 2010 season marked the only other three regular season contests without direct national championship implications over the last 13 seasons.

ONE AND ONLY: Since 2014, the start of the College Football Playoff era, Alabama has only lost one game by 13-plus points. The Crimson Tide's only loss by 13-plus points or more in that time period came in the Crimson Tide's 16-44 loss to Clemson in the College Football Playoff National Championship on Jan. 7, 2019. To compare, Clemson has three losses by 13-plus points in the same time span while Oklahoma has four and Ohio State has five.

ALABAMA HAS MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 150 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed by a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama finished 13-1 in 2012 and 2017, 11-2 in 2013 and 2019, 12-2 in 2014, and 14-1 in 2015, 2016 and 2018. Ohio State is second with 138 wins, followed by Clemson at No. 3 with 135. Boise State is fourth with 133 victories while Oklahoma rounds out the top five with 130.

2019 FRESHMAN STARTERS RETURN SIGNIFICANT EXPERIENCE: An injury plagued 2019 forced Alabama to utilize its freshmen earlier than anticipated. By season's end, the Crimson Tide matched Akron for the most true freshmen starters with nine apiece. UA started one freshman on offense and two on special teams with an NCAA-leading six on defense. All nine of those players remain on the Crimson Tide's 2020 roster, highlighted by Freshman All-Americans in linebackers Christian Harris and Shane Lee along with offensive lineman Evan Neal.

NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS IN THE SABAN ERA: Sophomore wide receiver Jaylen Waddle's 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown at Auburn on Nov. 30 of last season marked Alabama's 75th non-offensive touchdown of the Nick Saban era and the seventh in 2019. Alabama totaled seven non-offensive scores in 2018 and recorded a single-season record 15 in 2016, which led the Football Bowl Subdivision and was the most in a season by any FBS team in the last 20 years. Alabama scored a non-offensive touchdown in 10 consecutive games dating from to the CFP Semifinal vs. Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015, to the Texas A&M game on Oct. 22, 2016, and had 14 non-offensive touchdowns in that span – four interceptions, four punt returns, five fumble recoveries and a kickoff return.

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: Alabama has had more draft picks over the last 12 drafts (93) than any other college in the nation. An impressive 33 of those picks have been first-round selections. The list of 93 features seven Super Bowl champions, 22 Pro Bowl selections, nine First Team All-Pro members and one Offensive Rookie of the Year. The 2020 Draft featured nine former Alabama standouts that heard their name called across the three-day event. Following the 2020 edition, the Crimson Tide has now had 41 players taken in the last four NFL Drafts, marking four consecutive years that Alabama has had nine or more players drafted.

2020 NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw nine former players selected in the 2020 NFL Draft, including four first-round picks in Tua Tagovailoa (No. 5, Miami Dolphins), Jedrick Wills Jr. (No. 10, Cleveland Browns), Henry Ruggs III (No. 12, Las Vegas Raiders) and Jerry Jeudy (No. 15, Denver Broncos). Xavier McKinney (No. 36, New York Giants), Trevon Diggs (No. 51, Dallas Cowboys) and Raekwon Davis (No. 56, Miami Dolphins) followed in round two. Linebackers Terrell Lewis (No. 84, Los Angeles Rams) and Anfernee Jennings (No. 87, New England Patriots) rounded out the Tide's selections, each going in the third round. Alabama has now had at least nine players selected in four consecutive drafts and has produced multiple first-round picks in nine of the last 12 NFL Drafts with single first-round selections in 2009, 2015 and 2016.

OFF-THE-FIELD NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past 13 seasons under Nick Saban has coincided with the Tide's success in the classroom. The 2020 squad is no exception as Alabama entered the season with 15 players who already had degrees in hand heading into Fall Camp. The list of 15 includes: Deonte Brown, Joseph Bulovas, Logan Burnett, Ben Davis, Landon Dickerson, Joe Donald, Thomas Fletcher, Miller Forristall, Mac Jones, Alex Leatherwood, Joshua McMillon, Chris Owens, DeVonta Smith, Carl Tucker and Daniel Wright. Additionally, Forristall and Owens each earned both their bachelor's and master's degrees prior to the start of the 2020 slate. Since 2013, UA has seen 173 degrees earned (graduate and undergraduate) by players who were still suiting up for the Crimson Tide after having graduated. Since the 2010 season, Alabama has seen an impressive 26 players earn a master's degree before stepping foot on the field for the final time.

GRADUATING WITH THE BEST: The Alabama football team has not only been dominant on the field, but also in the classroom. In May of this year, the Crimson Tide posted a program record Academic Progress Rate (APR) mark of 990, which bettered the national average for Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams by 22 points. Alabama football also earned public recognition from the NCAA for their APR score figuring in the top-10 percentile nationally among all football teams. The Tide also moved up to an 85 in the most recent Graduation Success Rate (GSR) figures released last October. Those numbers covered student-athletes who attended the University during 2009-12. Alabama's 85 ranked third amongst Southeastern Conference football programs, marking the 11th year in a row that the Tide football squad has ranked in the top four in the SEC by GSR.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 810 of the 1,172 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 492-132-8 (.785) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including a 133-20 (.869) mark under head coach Nick Saban. Alabama is also ranked in the AP poll for the 199th consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid-1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. Alabama has started seven seasons at No. 1 (2018, 2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 30 seasons (1991-2020), and in 2014, Amway became the title sponsor. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017 seasons. The Tide has compiled four UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 and 1979) and six USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2017) coaches poll national titles.

ALABAMA SHARES 2019 AFCA ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD: The Alabama football program was among six recipients of the 2019 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement Award. It marked the second time in the last three years the Crimson Tide earned the recognition. Alabama was one of six football programs to receive the honor last year, joining the Air Force Academy, Clemson, Louisville, Rice and Utah. The NCAA's single-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) is used to select the winner and all six schools posted perfect scores of 1,000 for 2017-18. Each student-athlete receiving athletically related financial aid earns one point for staying in school and one point for being academically eligible. A team's total points are divided by points possible and then multiplied by 1,000 to equal the team's Academic Progress Rate. The award recognized the CFA-member Football Bowl Subdivision institution with the highest graduation rate among members of its football team. When the CFA disbanded in 1997, the AFCA stepped in to present the award.

DICKERSON, WILLS JR. EARN CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS: Offensive linemen Landon Dickerson and Jedrick Wills Jr. were both voted to the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District IV team. It was the second such honor for Wills Jr. and the first for Dickerson. Now pursuing his master's in business administration (MBA), Dickerson previously earned his undergraduate degree in management with a 3.68 GPA at Florida State. Wills Jr. carried a 3.44 GPA while pursuing a degree in finance. Following their selections a year ago, Alabama football has now tallied 19 CoSIDA All-District honors since 2009, including Academic All-America honors eight times under head coach Nick Saban, the most notable being Barrett Jones, the only four-time honoree in CoSIDA Football Academic All-America history.

ACADEMIC PROWESS: The Tide has been a model of success on the football field, but the team has generated plenty of accolades in the classroom as well. Below are some of the academic highlights under Nick Saban.

- A total of 15 Crimson Tide players will take the field with their degrees in hand for the season opener against Missouri.
- Earned Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 85 in 2018-19 ranked third among SEC football programs.
- In 2018, Alabama ranked among the national leaders with 22 graduates on its roster during postseason play. The Tide led the nation in graduates on its roster during postseason play in 2015 (29), 2014 (22) and 2013 (28).
- Alabama's five national title football teams under Nick Saban (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2017) included 114 players who had earned their degrees prior to game time.
- The 2014 team was recognized as one of the nation's top academic programs, ranking third in the annual academic rankings of the top 25 college football teams produced by New America, a Washington D.C. think-tank.
- The 2011 BCS national championship team had 21 graduates playing in the bowl game, which was the second most in the country.
- That 2011 team led the SEC with 38 student-athletes being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- The 2009 BCS national championship team led the country with 11 graduates playing in the bowl game.
- In 2017-18, Alabama finished second in the number of football student-athletes being named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll with 10 honorees. Alabama topped that list in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and shared the top spot in the 2015-16 academic year.

DICKERSON NOMINATED FOR THE WILLIAM V. CAMPBELL TROPHY: Offensive lineman Landon Dickerson was nominated for the William V. Campbell Trophy, awarded to the college football player who possesses the best combination of academics, community service and on-field performance. Now in graduate school, Dickerson wrapped up his undergraduate degree at Florida State University with a 3.684 cumulative grade-point average in sports management. His efforts helped him to graduate Cum Laude from FSU in just three years. While in Tallahassee, he was selected to the Dean's List five times and named to the ACC All-Academic Team in 2016. Arriving in Tuscaloosa in 2019, Dickerson enrolled in the University's MBA program and was selected to the CoSIDA Academic All-District IV team in 2019 in addition to earning SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll recognition as a redshirt junior. In addition to his standout efforts in the classroom, he has taken part in nearly 40 hours of community service across his two schools while also being selected to Alabama Football's Leadership Group for his senior season.

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE COMMUNITY: Last season, Alabama worked 100-plus hours of community service in Tuscaloosa and the surrounding areas. The team volunteered its time across numerous areas during the 2019 season including in schools, hospitals, local food banks, retirement homes, with Habitat for Humanity and on campus.

ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM NOMINEE NAJEE HARRIS: Running back Najee Harris was nominated for the 2020 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. The award is one of the most esteemed off-the-field honors in college football and recognizes nominees across all NCAA and NAIA divisions for the 2020 season. While at UA, Harris has been one of the Crimson Tide football team's most active members in the community. He has recorded nearly 50 hours of community service, highlighted by his volunteer efforts with the Alberta Head Start Unity Project where he has served as a positive role model for the children, reading to and mentoring the youth. Additionally, Harris and his teammates visited Fun Spot America in Orlando, Fla., for the Vrbo Citrus Bowl Day for Kids. Following that, Harris participated in the Dance Marathon for the Children's Miracle Network to help raise money for the Children's of Alabama hospital. His most recent volunteer effort saw the senior attend a "Night to Shine" as a prom buddy. The event is an unforgettable prom night experience for people with special needs and is hosted around the world in more than 720 host churches across 50 states and 34 countries.

FORRISTALL SELECTED TO WUERFFEL TROPHY WATCH LIST: Tight end Miller Forristall was tabbed to the 2020 Wuerffel Trophy Watch List, joining a group of 114 candidates up for the honor given to the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement. The redshirt senior has contributed over 200 hours of service across various communities during his time at the Capstone. He took two separate mission trips with the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA). While on those two trips, Forristall spent a week in Costa Rica coaching football camps while also helping to educate the community on healthy habits and conditions and followed that by traveling to a Nicaraguan Refugee Camp with fellow FCA student-athletes. In addition to his mission work, Forristall participated in hospital visits and community service events as part of the Tide's bowl trips during his time with the football team.

ALABAMA ATHLETICS AS A WHOLE: The University of Alabama has built a total program, winning championships on the field and bringing home plenty of academic awards in the classroom.

- Since 2008, Crimson Tide athletics teams have won 11 national championships in five different sports and 26 SEC championships in eight different sports. That tally includes two College Football Playoff National Championships and five SEC team titles in four different sports over the last five years. Overall, the Crimson Tide has won 27 national championships and 106 conference titles.
- Alabama Athletics tallied more than 150 graduates over the past academic year. That number includes an NCAA and World champion, 25 All-Americans and eight Academic All-Americans, as well as 16 master's degrees between winter, spring and summer graduates. The Tide's latest NCAA Graduation Success Rate was 91, two points higher than the year before, and stood third among SEC schools.
- On a department-wide basis, Alabama's more than 600 student-athletes averaged over a 3.5 grade-point average during 2019-20. All 17 programs earned better than a 2.9 GPA with 16 earning better than a 3.0 and 11 achieving a 3.5 GPA for the year, marking the 10th year in a row that at least five teams have met that standard.
- Alabama was also prolific when it came to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, coming away with the 385 honors during the 2019-20 academic year. The Tide had 78, 60 and 127 student-athletes named to the SEC Fall, Winter and Spring Academic Honor Rolls, respectively, and 120 named to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll.
- The Crimson Tide was once again among the national leaders when it comes to Academic All-America honors, totaling 12 during the 2019-20 academic year. With a dozen in 2019-20, Alabama is the only school to earn double-digit honors the last seven years in a row, totaling an NCAA-best 78 over that span. The Tide also leads the nation in Academic All-America honors since 2000 with 156 and is No. 1 in the SEC and fifth all-time with 192.
- Alabama student-athletes were voted the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year for their respective sports a conference-record eight times during the 2019-20 academic year. Crimson Tide student-athletes from 13 different teams have earned SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year recognition for their respective sports a conference-best 60 times since the honor's inception in 2003, tallying more than a dozen better than the next closest school.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

10 POINTS OR LESS: Alabama's trademark has been its defense ever since head coach Nick Saban's arrival on campus in 2007. Since that first season in Tuscaloosa, Saban-coached defenses have held the Crimson Tide's opponents to 10 points or less on 91 occasions. Dating back to the start of the 2015 season, UA's defense has limited the opposition to 10 or fewer points 35 times across 72 total contests.

TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS, TURNOVERS: With a pair of interceptions by Shyheim Carter and Josh Jobe against Michigan in the Vrbo Citrus Bowl on Jan. 1, 2020, the Crimson Tide has forced at least one turnover in 67 of its last 72 contests dating back to the start of the 2015 season. During the current run, the Crimson Tide has forced 120 turnovers (79 interceptions, 41 fumbles) and returned 25 of those miscues for touchdowns.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200: Western Carolina's 179 yards of total offense on Nov. 23 of last season marked the 51st time in the last 167 games under Nick Saban (since the start of the 2008 season) that the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposition to fewer than 200 yards of total offense.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300: The Crimson Tide defense held Western Carolina to 179 yards of total offense in Alabama's 66-3 victory over the Catamounts on Nov. 23, 2019, marking the 112th time in 180 games (62.2 percent) under head coach Nick Saban that the Tide has held an opponent to less than 300 yards of total offense. The Tide has limited 24 of its last 42 opponents below 300 yards, dating back to the start of the 2017 campaign.

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE: Since the start of the 2009 season, no team has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama has surrendered only 243 touchdowns over the last 153 games. That is 65 fewer than the second most in the nation (Florida and LSU with 308).

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama permitted nine scores on the ground through 13 games last season and just 41 in the last 72 games, dating to the start of the 2015 season. The Crimson Tide allowed 11 rushing touchdowns in 2018 after allowing nine rushing touchdowns in 2017. The Tide defense led the nation in 2016 with only five rushing touchdowns allowed, one year after giving up only seven rushing scores through 15 games in 2015, the second-lowest total in the country. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 97 rushing touchdowns. Iowa is No. 2 in that category, giving up 145 since 2007, followed by Ohio State (158) at No. 3. Utah is No. 4 at 162 while TCU (170) rounds out the group at No. 5.

RUSHING DEFENSE: Alabama has surrendered only 26 individual 100-yard rushing performances dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that is the fewest in the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival in 2007, the Tide has allowed 21 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

BALL PROTECTION: In the last 167 games dating to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has turned the ball over only 182 times (99 fumbles, 83 interceptions) for 1.09 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 164 times in 153 games (1.07/game). That number since 2009 includes 65 interceptions in 3,895 attempts (1 INT every 59.9 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 27 fumbles in 3,982 carries (one fumble lost every 147.5 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

OPENING DRIVE TOUCHDOWNS: Jerry Jeudy began the Vrbo Citrus Bowl with an 85-yard touchdown reception on the opening drive to help the Crimson Tide secure a win in its final game of the 2019 campaign. With that score, Alabama extended its streak to 34 straight wins when scoring a touchdown on its first offensive possession of a game. The Tide's last loss after finding the end zone on its first drive was to the Oklahoma Sooners in the 2014 Allstate Sugar Bowl.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: Alabama extended its school record for consecutive games with a score to 255 thanks to Jerry Jeudy's 85-yard catch and score from Mac Jones to start the Vrbo Citrus Bowl last season. The Crimson Tide was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama has a 197-55 (.782) record over the course of the current streak.

500+ YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE: Alabama recorded 515 yards of total offense in the loss at Auburn on Nov. 30 to close out the regular-season slate in 2019. The 500-plus yard performance marked the 33rd time in the last 72 games, dating to the start of the 2015 season, that the Crimson Tide has eclipsed the 500-yard mark. In 2018, UA totaled 500 or more yards in 12 of 15 games to set a single-season school record. The Tide followed that up by eclipsing 500 yards of offense in nine of the 13 games in the 2019 campaign.

HARRIS CLIMBING THE RUSHING CHARTS: Najee Harris exploded onto the scene in 2019 after taking over Alabama's starting tailback job. He accumulated 1,224 rushing yards to propel him into the top-15 for career rushers at UA. Harris has totaled 2,377 rushing yards for his career, a number that includes 783 yards as a sophomore and 370 yards as a freshman to go with his junior totals. Alabama's all-time leader for career rushing yards is Derrick Henry with 3,591 from 2013-15.

HARRIS - A THREAT IN THE RUSHING AND RECEIVING GAME: Senior Najee Harris enters the season as one of the top rushing threats but also has the ability to make an impact in the passing game. Harris contributed 20 total scores as a junior (13 rushing, seven receiving) to tie for fourth in Alabama single-season ranks for touchdowns scored. The running back's seven receiving scores are the most by any Crimson Tide tailback in program history and tied for ninth on UA's single-season receiving scores list. He contributed a rushing and receiving touchdown in three straight games across the LSU, Mississippi State and Western Carolina matchups, making him the first player in the Southeastern Conference to achieve that feat over at least the last 20 seasons.

SMITH SET TO REWRITE ALABAMA RECORD BOOKS: Wide receiver DeVonta Smith passed up the 2020 NFL Draft to return for his senior season and is on-pace to rewrite the Alabama record books. Smith has totaled 118 catches for 2,109 yards and 23 touchdowns while averaging 17.9 yards per grab. His career totals all rank him in the top-10 for each receiving category. Below is a look at where Smith's career numbers rank.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

WADDLE IS A PROBLEM: Junior Jaylen Waddle provides Alabama with a weapon that creates problems for the opposition in a variety of ways. The reigning SEC Special Teams Player of the Year, Waddle has returned punts and kickoffs for the Crimson Tide in addition to his play at wideout. Waddle finished his 2019 season with 1,227 all-purpose yards on his way to earning first team All-America accolades at returner. He led the nation and set the Alabama program record for single-season punt return average at 24.4 yards per return with 20 for 487 yards and a touchdown as a sophomore.

WADDLE CLIMBING THE PUNT RETURNS LIST: Jaylen Waddle has etched his name in the Alabama record books and looks to continue to climb the charts this season. Waddle has totaled 720 punt return yards for his career and is averaging a program-best 20.0 yards per return on his 36 returns. Below is a look at the junior's ranks all-time at UA.

SERIES NOTES

THE ALABAMA-MISSOURI SERIES: Alabama leads the all-time series with Missouri, 4-2. The most recent meeting came in 2018 when the Crimson Tide defeated the Tigers, 39-10, at Bryant-Denny Stadium for UA's Homecoming. Missouri won the first contest between the schools, taking a 35-10 decision from the Tide at the 1968 Gator Bowl before the teams met again at Legion Field in 1985 with the Tigers emerging with a 20-7 victory. Alabama then began its four-game winning streak against MU with a 38-20 win in Columbia, Mo., on Sept. 16, 1978. The two teams would not meet again until 2012, when Alabama handed Missouri a 42-13 loss in Columbia during the Tigers' first season in the Southeastern Conference. Saturday's game will be Alabama's second trip ever to Columbia.

SABAN VS. MISSOURI: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 3-0 all-time against Missouri, with all three victories coming during his tenure at UA. The Crimson Tide defeated Missouri, 42-10, on Oct. 13, 2012 in Columbia, Mo., in the Tigers' first season in the Southeastern Conference. The two programs met two seasons later in the 2014 SEC Championship Game with the Tide coming out on top, 42-13, in Atlanta, Ga., en route to the school's 16th national title. The latest pairing came in 2018 with Alabama cruising to a 39-10 win at Bryant-Denny Stadium on Homecoming.

SABAN MOVING UP SEC WINS LIST: Alabama head coach Nick Saban's 123 conference wins (including SEC championship games) ranks No. 3 on the SEC career conference wins list. Saban ranks first in league history in SEC regular season winning percentage at .815 (123-28). He is also second in SEC history in winning percentage in all games at .836 (199-39). Saban is fourth on the league's career wins list at 199 victories.

139-8 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama is 139-8 (.946) when leading at the half. The Crimson Tide has held the lead in 56 of its last 72 games dating back to the start of the 2015 season. UA is also 123-4 (.969) when leading by seven or more points at the break during the Saban era.

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: The Crimson Tide's matchup against Michigan on Jan. 1 was the Tide's 431st televised game. Alabama has compiled a 291-136-4 (.680) all-time record in televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed-circuit telecasts).

150 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 166 GAMES: Alabama's appearance on ABC for the Vrbo Citrus Bowl to close out the 2019 campaign was the Tide's 150th nationally televised game since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of the 2014 campaign.

RETURNING SUCCESS: The Alabama Crimson Tide returned 18 starters and 55 lettermen for the 2020 season. On offense, 27 letterwinners and eight starters returned while the defense welcomed back 23 lettermen and another seven starters. In addition, Alabama has three starting specialists returning. The offense welcomes back a bevy of experience, including Najee Harris, Alex Leatherwood and DeVonta Smith, who all elected to forego the NFL Draft and return for their senior seasons. Harris is joined by fellow senior rusher Brian Robinson Jr. to provide UA with one of the top running back combos in the nation. The offense also features the explosive wide receiver pairing of Smith and junior Jaylen Waddle to go with redshirt senior tight end Miller Forristall. Alabama's defense welcomes back its leader in the middle in senior Dylan Moses along with fellow veteran Joshua McMillon. The two backers will help direct a defensive front that returned redshirt junior LaBryan Ray, who missed most of the 2019 season due to injury. Ray is joined by sophomores Christian Barmore, DJ Dale, Justin Eboigbe and Byron Young who all saw significant playing time a season ago. The back end of the defense is led by one of the nation's top cornerback prospects in junior Patrick Surtain II who will be tasked with directing an inexperienced secondary. Alabama's specialist group is headlined by Waddle, who is the reigning SEC Special Teams Player of the Year and provides UA with a scoring threat each time he touches the ball in the return game.

SEC RECORD: Alabama extended its record for most consecutive 10-win seasons in SEC history to 13 when it defeated Western Carolina 66-3, on Nov. 23 of last season. The Crimson Tide finished 11-2 on the year following a win in the Vrbo Citrus Bowl over Michigan. UA had a 12-2 record in 2008, 14-0 in 2009, 10-3 in 2010, 12-1 in 2011, 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014, 14-1 marks in 2015, 2016 and 13-1 in 2017 and a 14-1 mark in 2018.

SABAN AT NO. 1: Among active head coaches during the 2020 campaign, Alabama head coach Nick Saban has coached the most game as the Associated Press Poll's No. 1 team. Saban has coached 80 games as the nation's top-ranked team which is 65 more games than second-place Dabo Swinney, who has totaled 15 games at No. 1 heading into Week 3 of the 2020 season. Third on the list is Kansas' Les Miles, who has coached 14 games as the top-ranked team in the AP Poll. The fourth coach on the list is Texas A&M's Jimbo Fisher who coached 10, all coming during the 2013-14 seasons at Florida State. Ranking fifth on the list is a trio of coaches at seven games in UCLA's Chip Kelly, LSU's Ed Orgeron and Ohio's Frank Solich.

MORE THAN A DECADE AT NO. 1: With Alabama's Sept. 29, 2019, ranking at No. 1, the Crimson Tide has been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll at least once each season since 2008. The 12-year streak is the longest in the history of the AP rankings. The previous long streak was seven seasons by Miami (Fla.) from 1986-92. The Crimson Tide began the 2020 campaign ranked at No. 3 in the AP.

LONGEST TOP-FIVE STREAK: The Crimson Tide's Nov. 24, 2019, ranking at No. 5 in the Associated Press Top 25 marked the 68th consecutive AP poll in which Alabama had been ranked in the top-five. That stretch of top-five rankings was the longest streak in the poll's history, surpassing the previous record of 54 straight weeks set by Miami from Oct. 8, 2000 through Oct. 26, 2003. Alabama's run in the top-five began on Nov. 8, 2015, following a dominant 30-16 victory by the seventh-ranked Tide over then-No. 4 LSU at Bryant-Denny Stadium and concluded in a 45-48 loss at then No. 16 Auburn on Nov. 30. During that span, the Crimson Tide maintained a 57-5 (.919) record and claimed two national championships to go with three Southeastern Conference titles.

LONGEST ACTIVE TOP-10 STREAK: Alabama's No. 5 ranking in the Nov. 24 Associated Press Top 25 Poll marked the 74th consecutive week the Tide appeared in the AP top-10, which led the Football Bowl Subdivision for most consecutive weeks in the top-10 in the writers' poll. The streak was ended following Alabama's loss at Auburn on Nov. 30. Prior to the 2019 set of rankings released prior to the season, Alabama's last appearance below No. 10 was the week of Sept. 27, 2015, when the Tide was No. 13 heading to a matchup at Georgia, which resulted in a 38-10 UA victory over the No. 8 Bulldogs.

SABAN LEADS IN WINS VS. TOP-FIVE TEAMS: Alabama's 45-34 win over No. 4 Oklahoma in the 2018 Capital One Orange Bowl on Dec. 29 was Nick Saban's 24th career victory against a team ranked in the top five of the Associated Press Top 25, the most in college football history. Saban's 24-14 career record in top-five contests gives him a .632 winning percentage, which is also college football's best. Following Saban on the all-time victory list are Bobby Bowden (18/.378 winning percentage), Barry Switzer (15/.516), Woody Hayes (15/.516), Steve Spurrier (15/.429) and Lou Holtz (15/.419). Saban's record includes six wins in the College Football Playoff: No. 3 Michigan State (38-0) and No. 1 Clemson (45-40) in 2015; No. 4 Washington (24-7) in 2016; No. 1 Clemson (24-6) and No. 3 Georgia (26-23) in 2017; and a 45-34 victory over fourth-ranked Oklahoma in 2018. Alabama also went 3-0 in BCS National Championship Games (vs. Texas, 37-21, 2009; vs. LSU, 21-0, 2011; vs. Notre Dame, 42-14, 2012).

AGAINST THE TOP 10: Since the start of the 2008 season, the Crimson Tide has posted a 30-11 (.732) overall record against top-10 teams, including a 15-5 (.750) mark versus the top 10 since the inception of the College Football Playoff. In Saban's five national championship seasons at Alabama, his teams have gone 17-2 against top-10 opponents.

SABAN VS. AP TOP 25: Alabama's 35-16 win over then-No. 17 Michigan in the Vrbo Citrus Bowl on Jan. 1 was Nick Saban's 84th career win vs. the Associated Press Top 25, pushing him two behind Joe Paterno's 86 career wins against the AP Top 25, a total that is tops in the history the poll. Last season, Saban's win over then-No. 24 Texas A&M moved him ahead of Florida State legend Bobby Bowden for second all-time. Alabama's Paul "Bear" Bryant is fourth at 66. Former Duke, Florida and South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier is fifth at 64. Saban's winning percentage against AP ranked teams (84-42, .667) tops Bryant (.592), Bowden (.557), Spurrier (.529) and Paterno (.512).

ALABAMA vs. NO. 1: Alabama holds the record for the most wins all-time against the Associated Press Poll's No. 1 team since the poll was introduced in 1936. The Crimson Tide has compiled 10 wins against the AP's top-ranked team in program history, most recently against No. 1 Clemson in the 2017 College Football Playoff Semifinal at the Allstate Sugar Bowl. Six of those 10 wins have come during the Nick Saban era with the first being Alabama's victory over defending national champion Florida in the 2009 SEC Championship Game to send the Crimson Tide to the BCS National Championship Game against Texas. Three of the next four occurred in national title games, including LSU (2011), Notre Dame (2012) and Clemson (2015). The sixth win during the Saban era came when the Crimson Tide took down top-ranked Mississippi State inside Bryant-Denny Stadium on Nov. 15, 2014.

BEATING THE BEST: The Crimson Tide is 60-17 (.779) against the Associated Press Top 25, including a 32-10 (.762) mark against AP top-10 teams since the start of 2008. Alabama finished 2-2 against ranked opponents in 2019, one year removed from going 5-1 against ranked opponents in 2018. Alabama was tasked with a gauntlet schedule in 2017 that featured 10 teams ranked in the AP Poll, going 9-1 and outscoring those opponents by an average score of 38.0-17.3.

OUTSIDE THE TOP 15: In addition to its 91-game winning streak against unranked teams, Alabama has lost just two games to teams ranked outside the top 15 in the Associated Press poll since the start of the 2008 season (No. 19 South Carolina in 2010, No. 16 Auburn in 2019). For perspective, no team in the FBS has lost fewer than 10 games to teams outside the top 15 in that same time frame.

THE 2010s WERE THE TIDE'S DECADE: Alabama won 124 games during the 2010s to lead all NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision teams and tie for college football's all-time mark. Ohio State was second on the wins list during the last decade with 116. Alabama has been the wins leader in two other decades in program history, including the 1960s (85 wins) and 1970s (103 wins). Predating the creation of the NCAA, Penn won 124 games and Harvard won 116 as major college football powers in the 1890s.

10-YEAR RUN: Nick Saban entered 2018 with a 125-14 (.899) record over his previous 10 seasons in Tuscaloosa (2008-17), which is the best of any major college school over a 10-year span since Bud Wilkinson and Oklahoma in the late 1940s through the late 1950s. UA's 125 wins over that decade are the most for any FBS school during a 10-year span in the Associated Press poll era (since 1936).

SABAN AMONG 20-YEAR LEADERS: Alabama's 45-40 win over Clemson in the 2016 College Football Playoff Championship Game was head coach Nick Saban's 191st victory in his first 20 years as a college head coach. That total is the second-most in FBS history for a coach in the first 20 seasons of his career. Former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne won 195 games in the opening two decades of his tenure in Lincoln. Long-time Penn State head coach Joe Paterno ranks third with 187. Saban's five national championships in 20 seasons tops both Osborne (none) and Paterno (one).

NEW HIRES: Saban's 2020 coaching staff features only one new face in Freddie Roach. Most recently at Ole Miss from 2018-19, Roach was hired to direct Alabama's defensive line. He returns to the Capstone after serving as the Tide's director of player development from 2015-17. Roach's first stint on the Alabama coaching staff came from 2008-10 as an assistant strength and conditioning coach. As a player for the Crimson Tide, Roach was a four-year letterman at linebacker from 2002-05. He was named the National Freshman of the Year in addition to earning Freshman All-America accolades and was twice tabbed as a second team All-SEC honoree.

SABAN AND FIRST ROUND NFL DRAFT PICKS: Since the advent of the NFL Draft, Alabama head coach Nick Saban has produced the most first-rounders of any NCAA Division I head coach. Saban has coached a total of 38 players who were chosen in the opening round of the draft, including 33 while at Alabama. This year's four selections in the 2020 NFL Draft extended Saban's all-time mark. He has now produced five more first-rounders than second-place Joe Paterno. With the first-round selection of quarterback Tua Tagovailoa in the 2020 NFL Draft, Saban has produced at least one first-rounder at every starting position on offense and defense during his illustrious collegiate head coaching career.

CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS: The Alabama football program is again well-represented in the NFL during the 2020 season with numerous former players on league rosters. The Tide has 72 former players (active, injured reserve, practice squad) working on an NFL roster. Heading into Week 1 of the new league year, 57 of those players were on an active roster - a total that led all of college football programs. In the last 12 NFL Drafts (including 2020), Alabama has had 96 players selected, including 33 players in first round and 30 across the second and third rounds.

- Saban has compiled a 248-65-1 (.791) record as a college head coach to date (243-65-1, .788 after vacations). He has six national championships – five at Alabama – nine conference championships and 20 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons and the College Football Playoff Semifinals in five of the last six seasons including the last four CFP National Championship Games.

- Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships, the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships and one of only two coaches to win multiple CFP National Championships. He has won six titles in his last 15 years coaching college football, most recently capturing the CFP National Championship following the 2017 season. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years. He is also just the second coach in the poll era to win six national championships (Paul "Bear" Bryant) and the first to ever win five titles in a nine-year span.

- In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. He made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game. He took down Clemson 45-40 to capture title No. 5 following the 2015 season in the CFP National Championship Game. He captured his sixth national championship - and fifth at Alabama - in 2017 with a 26-23 overtime win over Georgia in the 2018 CFP National Championship Game.

- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

- A five-season run at LSU (2000-04) produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships and three SEC West Division championships. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America.

- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach, including four postseason appearances. In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season.

- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points) and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and one grandson, James.

- At Michigan State, the Sabans started the Nick's Kids Foundation, which is dedicated to raising awareness for deserving organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the southeast. Thanks to the generosity of the donors and the efforts of Nick and Terry Saban, the Nick's Kids Foundation has donated nearly \$9 million dollars to many deserving organizations and causes since arriving in Tuscaloosa.

- Personally, Nick and Terry have given over \$1 million dollars to their First Generation Scholarship at The University of Alabama and have pledged \$1 million dollars to The Crimson Standard Initiative. They have also made major contributions to their church, St. Francis Catholic Church, to build the Saban Catholic Student Center that was completed in August of 2016.

ATLANTA — A stout defense paired with stellar quarterback play propelled the No. 2/2-ranked Alabama to a 42-3 win over Duke in the 2019 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Mercedes-Benz Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The victory to start the season moved the Crimson Tide to 6-0 all-time in Chick-fil-A Kickoff Games and to 14-1 in games played in Atlanta since head coach Nick Saban arrived in Tuscaloosa, including 13 straight wins.

The Crimson Tide defense limited the Blue Devils to only 204 yards of total offense and forced three turnovers on the day. Junior defensive back Xavier McKinney led all defenders with eight tackles while Trevon Diggs made an impact in the turnover department. The senior defensive back picked off a pass while also recovering a fumble to go with a pair of tackles. The fumble was forced by Patrick Surtain II with the sophomore also contributing a pass breakup and four tackles.

Alabama's offense began slowly but kept the pressure on from the second quarter until the final whistle. Junior quarterback Tua Tagovailoa accounted for four touchdowns - all through the air - as part of his 26-of-31 passing effort totaling 336 yards. Ten of Tagovailoa's throws went to fellow junior Jerry Jeudy. The third-year wideout finished with a career-high 10 catches for 137 yards and a touchdown. Redshirt freshman running back Jerome Ford led the Tide runners, totaling 64 yards and a score on 10 carries.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The No. 2/2 ranked Crimson Tide put 603 yards of total offense in its 62-10 win over New Mexico State in Alabama's home opener inside Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Tide's huge offensive day was Alabama's first 600-plus yard performance since 2018 when UA eclipsed the 600-yard mark at Arkansas.

On offense, junior quarterback Tua Tagovailoa totaled 227 yards and three touchdowns on 16-of-24 passing, to go along with a 25-yard rushing touchdown as part of his 33 yards on the ground. Fellow junior, wideout Jerry Jeudy, had a career-high three touchdowns and ended his day with eight receptions for 103 yards. Wide receiver Henry Ruggs III added 141 yards of total offense and two scores with the junior tallying one rushing and one receiving.

The defense was led by senior Raekwon Davis and junior Xavier McKinney with the pair tying for the most tackles at six apiece. Sophomore defensive back Patrick Surtain came up with his first interception of the season while also forcing a fumble, one of two for the Tide on the day that made up Alabama's three total turnovers.

COLUMBIA, S.C. — The No. 2/2-ranked Alabama Crimson Tide beat South Carolina, 47-23, in both teams' Southeastern Conference opener in Columbia, S.C., on Saturday afternoon at Williams-Brice Stadium. The win moved Alabama to 3-0 overall and improved UA to 12-1 in SEC openers (home and away) under head coach Nick Saban.

The offense was led once again by quarterback Tua Tagovailoa. The junior totaled a career-best 444 yards and a career-high tying five touchdowns through the air on 28-of-36 passing. Running back Najee Harris had a huge game with the junior hauling in five passes for 87 yards and two touchdowns to go with 36 yards rushing.

Junior wide receivers DeVonta Smith and Henry Ruggs III tallied 136 and 122 yards, respectively, marking just the ninth time in school history that two Alabama receivers have gone over 100 yards in the same game. Smith caught two touchdown passes while Ruggs III hauled in one of his own.

On defense, 22 players recorded a tackle, led by junior safety Xavier McKinney, who tallied nine, including five solo stops. McKinney also recorded an interception and a tackle for loss. Redshirt senior linebacker Anfernee Jennings forced a fumble and had a sack while the freshman duo of defensive lineman DJ Dale and defensive back Jordan Battle also notched sacks on the afternoon.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Junior quarterback Tua Tagovailoa made Alabama history by throwing for five touchdown passes for the second consecutive week and the third time in his career as the No. 2/2 Alabama football team defeated Southern Miss, 49-7, in Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Tagovailoa completed 17-of-21 passes for 293 yards and five passing scores marking the first time in Alabama history that a quarterback has had back-to-back games with four or more touchdown passes. On the receiving end of two of those touchdown throws was junior wideout Henry Ruggs III, who had four catches for a career-best 148 yards. Fellow junior wideout Jerry Jeudy caught six passes for 96 yards while also contributing two touchdown receptions. On the ground, Najee Harris totaled 110 yards on 14 carries with the junior adding a touchdown catch from five yards out.

On defense, senior defensive back Jared Mayden led the Tide with a career-high eight tackles, while freshman linebacker Christian Harris finished second in stops with six, including 1.5 for loss (-4 yards). Senior Trevon Diggs grabbed his second interception of the season while redshirt sophomore Phidarian Mathis forced a fumble that was recovered by freshman Jordan Battle for the Tide defense's two turnovers on the day.

The Tide signal-caller recorded four scores through the air in the game and now has 81 for his career. Junior running back Najee Harris was tops in the UA ground game, totaling a career-high 20 carries resulting in a season-best 114 yards.

Junior DeVonta Smith totaled 99 receiving yards and one touchdown on a team-high seven catches to lead all Alabama wide receivers. Sophomore wideout and punt returner Jaylen Waddle totaled 176 all-purpose yards after catching three passes for 48 yards and his first receiving touchdown of the season to go with 128 yards on his four punt returns. Junior Henry Ruggs III had one score on his only grab of the day from 33-yards out while also accounting for 131 yards on four kickoff returns.

On defense, linebackers Anfernee Jennings and freshman Shane Lee tallied a team-high eight tackles apiece. Jennings, a redshirt senior, added one sack, a pair of tackles for loss and one pass breakup on the day. Senior defensive back Shyheim Carter anchored the Tide secondary with seven tackles, two pass breakups and a forced fumble.

Junior running back Najee Harris anchored the Tide offense, carrying the ball a career-high 21 times for 105 yards and two rushing scores. He also added four catches for 48 yards on the night. Junior quarterback Tua Tagovailoa was 11-of-12 for 155 yards through the air before leaving with an injury in the second quarter. Redshirt sophomore Mac Jones came in to replace Tagovailoa at quarterback and went 6-of-11 for 72 yards. Redshirt freshman Slade Bolden attempted his first career pass, completing the throw to Miller Forristall for a six-yard score to cap off the offense's scoring on the Third Saturday in October.

The redshirt senior contributed three total tackles and added a team-best two quarterback hurries in his final game at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Sophomore wide receiver Jaylen Waddle combined for four touchdowns on the day, including a 98-yard kickoff return for a score, as well as 98 receiving yards and touchdowns of 58, 12 and 28 yards on just four catches. Waddle finished his day with 230 all-purpose yards.

The offense was led by redshirt sophomore Mac Jones. The quarterback, making his third start of the year, went 26-of-39 for 335 yards and four touchdowns to go with two interceptions. Alabama's ground game was paced by Najee Harris. The junior led both teams with 146 rushing yards on 27 attempts and scored once while adding 26 receiving yards on four catches. Junior Henry Ruggs III paced all receivers with 99 yards on six catches and added one touchdown.

Junior defensive back Xavier McKinney and senior defensive lineman Raekwon Davis led the Tide with eight tackles each, including seven solo stops apiece. McKinney also forced a fumble in the second quarter.

ORLANDO, Fla. — No. 13/9/9 Alabama beat No. 14/17/17 Michigan, 35-16, in the Vrbo Citrus Bowl at Camping World Stadium in the first college football game of the new year. With the win, the Crimson Tide climbed to 11-2 on the season, giving Alabama its ninth consecutive season with 11 or more wins, the longest streak in the poll era (since 1936).

Jerry Jeudy used a career day to earn Citrus Bowl MVP honors, totaling a career-high 204 yards on just six catches. The junior wide receiver averaged 34 yards per reception and had the game's long completion on an 85-yard touchdown catch from redshirt sophomore quarterback Mac Jones for the Tide's first offensive play of the game. Jones went 16-of-25 for 327 yards and three touchdowns through the air with completions to six different targets.

Junior defensive back Xavier McKinney and redshirt senior linebacker Anfernee Jennings had 10 total tackles apiece to lead the Crimson Tide defense. Freshman linebacker Shane Lee led UA with seven solo stops and had nine tackles overall. McKinney and Lee both came up with sacks while Jennings and senior defensive lineman Tevita Musika combined for a third sack. Senior defensive back Shyheim Carter and sophomore corner Jose Jobe came up with interceptions, both of which came in the second half.
