





Since 2010, Nebraska's population has increased 7.4%, but 69 counties have lost population


Percent change in population 2010 - 20202020 total population = 1,961,504






Brain drain, or net-outmigration of persons with a bachelor's degree or more, has persisted since 2010 and the trend is negative

Net migration by educational attainment annually 2010 to 2021







When deciding to relocate, how important were each of the following factors?





Many states have a higher share of high wage workers compared to Nebraska


Percent of workforce in high wages occupations 2021 and 50 state rank


Many states are adding high wage jobs faster than Nebraska

Percent change in the share of workforce that are in high wages jobs 2018 to 2021 and 50 state rank




Many of those states adding high wage jobs faster than Nebraska also have "brain gain"
