



her that it was "Dre." After she unlocked the door, TRM went back to sleep and about an hour or an hour and a half later, she felt the defendant get into bed with her. The defendant does not live with her, but she allows him to stay there. The defendant is the father of JTW.

TRM woke up when she heard the defendant screaming. The defendant was screaming "Shank" (TMB) shot "Fatty" (JTW) and kept repeating it. TRM asked the defendant where TMB got a gun and the defendant said he had it behind the cable box. The defendant told TMR that the gun was Dre's gun and because Dre was drunk, he took the gun and put it behind the cable box.

TRM tried to ask TMB where he got the gun, but he did not answer. TRM said that TMB has been asking her for a BB gun because one of the neighbor children has a BB gun.

In a forensic interview, TMB told Officer Trisha Klauser that he "shot JTW on accident." TMB said that yesterday the defendant had a knife, gun, and drugs at the house. TMB described the drugs as pills, weed, and blunts. JTW described the gun as black and said that JTW grabbed the gun from behind the cable box and handed it to him. While this happened, his mom and the defendant were sleeping in the bed.

Detectives from the Milwaukee Police Department went to the residence at 2346 N. 18<sup>th</sup> Street, City and County of Milwaukee, where TRM, TMB, and JTW live and the defendant was staying on 7/21/18. As Detective Michael Fedel reports, he entered the bedroom where the shooting occurred and saw a pink stool pushed up to the left side of the dresser. Detective Fedel observed blood on top of the stool and around the stool. On top of the dresser, Detective Fedel saw a black handgun with an extended magazine. The firearm was loaded with one round in the chamber and an additional thirty rounds in the extended capacity magazine. Next to the gun, Detective Fedel observed a small plastic bag with suspected marijuana and an orange prescription pill bottle with suspected crack cocaine. The fitted sheet to the bed also had blood on it. Underneath the bed, Detective Fedel saw a single spent silver 9mm Luger casing.

Detective Fedel subjected a representative sample of the suspected crack cocaine to a Nark II 07 field test, which complainant knows is used to detect the presence of cocaine and that said test was positive for the presence of cocaine. The cocaine weighed 3.53 grams. The cocaine was packaged in five small, tied corner cut baggies and one medium sized plastic bag which held the majority of the substance.

Detective Fedel conducted a Nark II 05 field test on the suspected marijuana, which complainant knows is used to detect the presence of THC and that said test was positive for the presence of THC, the active ingredient in marijuana. The total weight of the marijuana was .74 grams.

Detective Fedel observed that the bullet went through the carpet and bedroom floor. A fired projectile was located in the basement of the residence. The fired bullet was partially mushroomed but still intact.

Detective Anderson learned that JTW had sustained a gunshot wound to the top of his left foot with an exit wound on the interior instep. JTW had no broken bones in his foot but did undergo a surgical procedure to clean the wound. Photographs of the injury were taken by detectives.

On 7/22/18, Detective Adrian Harris spoke with "Dre," identified as DPD, DOB 2/10/1990. DPD said that he was with the defendant on 7/21/2018 around 8am and that they were drinking. DPD said that he left his Taurus 9mm firearm with the defendant because he did not want to have the firearm while he was driving. DPD told Detective Harris that he is a CCW permit holder and purchased the firearm at Farm and Fleet.

This complaint is also based upon examination of records maintained by the Wisconsin Circuit Court Access Program (CCAP) in Racine County case no. 2018CF000101, in which the defendant was

charged with three counts of the felony offense of Second Degree Recklessly Endangering Safety, in violation of Wisconsin Statutes Section 941.30(2) and one count of misdemeanor battery, in violation of Wisconsin Statutes Section 940.19(1). That file further reflects that the defendant was released from custody in that case under the provisions of Wisconsin Statutes 969, with a condition that the defendant have no contact with TKB, TRM, and JTW, including those individuals person, property, residence ,or family. Additionally, complainant knows that a condition of bond under Wisconsin Statute 969 is that the defendant commit no new crimes. The above conditions of bond were in effect at the time of this offense. Certified copies of the bail bond form and docket entries from Racine County have been ordered and will be attached upon receipt.

**NOTICE OF INTENT TO INTRODUCE DVD OF CHILD INTERVIEW AT PRELIMINARY HEARING OR FURTHER PROCEEDINGS:**

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. sec. 908.08(2)(a), the State of Wisconsin by Assistant District Attorney Jennifer J. Tate hereby advises the court and the defendant that it may offer into evidence at the preliminary hearing or further proceedings in this matter the recorded statement of TMB (DOB: 10-03-2013). The recorded statement of the child the State seeks to introduce was made on Saturday, July 21, 2018. The recorded statement was made at the Child Advocacy Center at 619 W. Walnut Street; Milwaukee, WI. The forensic interviewer was Trisha Klauser, a police officer with the Milwaukee Police Department, Sensitive Crimes Division. A digital copy of the forensic interview will be provided to defense counsel as part of the discovery materials.
