Summary of Offenses and Probable Cause Affidavit

On November 23, 2022, I was directed to respond to [REDACTED] Port St. Lucie in reference to an adult male identified as Daniel Weber handling a firearm from which a round was discharged, striking Weber's [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] will be referred to as the victim for the remainder of this report.

Upon my arrival at the residence, it was secured pending a search warrant. Weber agreed to speak with law enforcement. Due to Weber smelling of an alcoholic beverage, he was transported to the Port St. Lucie Police Department, along with his [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was a witness to this incident, as he was seated immediately next to his father while this incident occurred.

Detective F. Knaggs and I met with Mr. Weber. The following is a brief synopsis of his video and audio recorded statement. The verbatim statement was later entered into evidence for review. Events may be out of order for clarity and flow.

Mr. Weber stated that on today's date, he wanted to show his son, [REDACTED] how to clean his "AR-15" rifle. Mr. Weber advised that he and [REDACTED] sat down on the sofa in the living room of their residence, and he placed his gun on what he described as a "TV tray". Mr. Weber indicated that he retrieved the firearm [REDACTED] and that he removed the magazine from the firearm prior to bringing it out to the living room area. Mr. Weber advised that he believed the firearm to be empty, and that he did check the firearm for the presence of ammunition. He stated that the "TV tray" on which the firearm was placed began to fall forward, causing the gun to fall forward as well. Mr. Weber stated that he and [REDACTED] both stood up and reached for the firearm as it hit the ground and subsequently fired a single round. Mr. Weber indicated that the safety on the firearm was not activated, and that as the firearm struck the ground, he heard the gunshot. Mr. Weber stated that he then heard [REDACTED] the victim, begin to cry and that he ultimately learned that she'd suffered a gunshot wound to her left hip/lower abdomen. Mr.

Weber applied pressure to the victim's wound and instructed [REDACTED] to get his cell phone and contact 911. Mr. Weber stated that he then got on the phone with 911 dispatch who told him to remove the firearm from the living room area and to secure it away. Mr. Weber advised he removed the firearm and placed it in his bedroom.

Mr. Weber was read his Miranda Rights, which he stated he understood and agreed to continue speaking with law enforcement.

Mr. Weber described himself to be experienced at handling firearms and indicated that he'd handled several different types/calibers of firearms for several years. Mr. Weber stated that he'd shot this firearm with which the victim was shot in recent months and that he had no indication of it having any type of malfunction issues. Mr. Weber stated that he has never had any accidental discharges with any firearms, nor has he been involved in any other shooting incidents.

St. Lucie County Fire District assisted with conducting an initial exigent blood draw from Mr. Weber. After completion, this blood draw kit was sealed and secured into evidence. After the blood draw, Mr. Weber continued to speak with me regarding today's incident.

Mr. Weber indicated that [REDACTED] relationship with [REDACTED] the victim, is a good relationship and that they do not have any issues.

Detective R. Giaccone obtained a search warrant for Mr. Weber's blood draw which was executed, and blood was obtained while Mr. Weber was inside of the same audio/video recorded interview room at the Port St. Lucie Police Department. After completion, this blood draw kit was sealed and secured into evidence.

Detective F. Knaggs met with [REDACTED]. The following is a brief synopsis of his video and audio recorded statement. The verbatim statement was later entered into evidence for review. Events may be out of order for clarity and flow.

[REDACTED] advised that his father was showing him specifics about a rifle as they sat on the sofa in the living room, when it fell to the ground and went off. [REDACTED] advised that the round struck [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that his father typically has a few beers and few mixed drinks before work, and then maybe a couple more on his days off. [REDACTED] advised that on today's date, his father maybe had two beers and like three mixed drinks. [REDACTED] indicated that his father began drinking around noon, and that he had his last one maybe around 3:00 p.m. [REDACTED] explained the term of "mixed drink" as whiskey and lemonade, and described these mixed drinks as being in "Yeti" cups, while holding his hands in a manner indicating a large cup. [REDACTED] stated that his father drinks every day.

On today's date, Mr. Weber did knowingly consume multiple alcoholic beverages, to his own admission, as well as the statements provided by his son, [REDACTED]. Mr. Weber acknowledged his consumption of approximately six beers, while [REDACTED] advised of his own observations of Mr. Weber consuming approximately two beers and approximately three "mixed drinks", consisting of whiskey and lemonade. [REDACTED] stated that Mr. Weber typically consumes alcoholic beverages daily, including just prior to his employment shifts.

Mr. Weber expressed his extensive knowledge of firearms and acknowledged how dangerous the handling of firearms can be, even by an experienced individual. However, Mr. Weber actions on today's date were extremely negligent, [REDACTED]

beverages and subsequently chose to begin handling a firearm which was irresponsibly handled, causing the victim to suffer a gunshot wound from high caliber rifle round in the lower left abdomen.

Mr. Weber failed to provide appropriate supervision for several minor children by consuming several alcoholic beverages and making the decision to willfully handle a large caliber firearm. Mr. Weber's decision to do so led to the victim suffering great bodily injury and suffering a gunshot wound from a high caliber firearm, requiring immediate surgery and extensive care.

After considering above-mentioned facts and statements, Mr. Weber was arrested for the violation of the following Florida State Statutes:

F.S.S. 827.03 (2)(b)- Aggravated Child Abuse

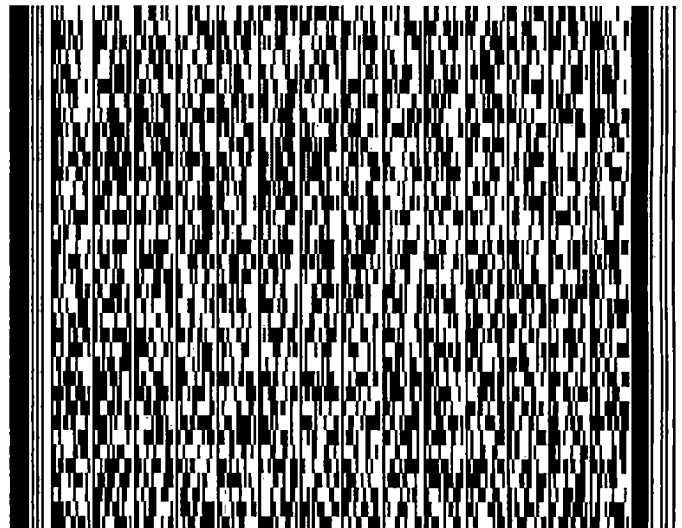
F.S.S. 790.151- Using Firearm while Under the Influence of Alcoholic Beverages
