PLEA FOR PROSECUTION OF HATE CRIMES AND FEDERAL CRIMINAL CHARGES AGAINST RANKIN COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI DEPUTIES

Dear A.A.G. Kristen Clarke:

On the night of January 24, 2023, on the heels of Tyree Nichols' nearby police beating death in Memphis, Tennessee, a shocking, criminal incident of police torture and excessive force occurred by the hands of six White Rankin County, Mississippi deputies against two African-American male citizens. This incident of severe police brutality is widely known in the national media and has justifiably aroused demands for justice from many quarters because this incident sets the standard for what is wrong with policing in America today.

The names of the African-American victims are Michael Corey Jenkins (32) and Eddie Terrell Parker (35). This vicious, nearly two-hour ordeal in Braxton, Mississippi, tragically ended with a Rankin County deputy placing his gun inside Michael Jenkins' mouth and firing it. Sheriff Bryan Bailey leads and supervises the Rankin County Sheriff's Department. According to eyewitnesses, the identity of these six White officers included; Rankin Co. Miss. deputy Brett

McAlpin, Rankin Co. Miss. deputy Christian Dedmon, and Rankin Co. Miss. deputy Hunter Elward.² Rankin County, Mississippi, is 73.5% White, 21% Black, according to 2019 data³

In the course of this nearly two-hour ordeal, while handcuffed and under the complete control of Rankin deputies, Michael Corey Jenkins and Eddie Terrell Parker were the victims of a series of criminal acts by these rogue officers, who, under the color of law, forced their way into their residence without even a pretense of any warrant. These acts by deputies included:

- Repeatedly beating Michael C. Jenkins and Eddie Terrell Parker while handcuffed;
- Repeatedly Tasering both victims while handcuffed; ⁴
- Waterboarding both victims while handcuffed in the course of interrogation;
- Attempting to sexually assault both victims with a dildo (sexual device) in the course of detention;
- Having both victims strip naked and shower together in the course of interrogation;
- Hurling eggs at the victims;
- Threatening to kill both victims by pointing guns at the heads of both victims;
- Using racial slurs such as "nigger' and "monkey" and other racial accusations against the victims in the course of all actions described herein;
- Attempting to kill Michael Jenkins. A White Rankin County Deputy placed his gun inside Michael Jenkins's mouth and shot him, attempting to kill him, severely and permanently wounding Jenkins.⁵

A complete <u>Statement of Facts</u> and <u>Recommendation for Criminal Charges</u> has been included under Attachment 1.

At no point in this encounter did either Michael Jenkins or Eddie Parker ever resist, run away from, or oppose the deputies in any way. Throughout this nearly two-hour ordeal, Michael Jenkins and Eddie Parker would completely comply with law enforcement.

While under Rankin County deputies' custody, Michael Jenkins and Eddie Parker were repeatedly and directly called "niggers" and "monkeys" and other specific racial slurs by these White officers. Upon entry, Rankin County deputies, including deputies McAlpin, Demon, and Elward, also accused the African-American men of "dating White women" and having committed other racial violations. Deputies intentionally and freely used random racial epithets for nearly two hours during all actions described herein.

Initially, Rankin County falsely alleged that Michael Jenkins had a weapon. Since then, Rankin County has offered no proof to support its initial contention that they shot Michael Jenkins in self-defense. Instead, Rankin County, in typical fashion, has proceeded to engage in a blatant cover-up of this incident, refusing to release information on the investigation other than to supply limited, severely redacted reports.⁷

After considering all facts contained herein and in the attached <u>Statement of Facts</u> (Attachment 1) and <u>Exhibits</u> (Attachment 2), a fair and reasonable-minded prosecutor could conclude that, or about January 24, 2023, Rankin County Mississippi deputies and the Rankin County Sheriff's Department, violated the following federal criminal civil rights statutes and Mississippi state criminal laws:

- **Title 18, U.S.C., Section 249** Matthew Shepard and James Byrd, Jr., Hate Crimes Prevention Act.
- Title 18, U.S.C., Section 241 Conspiracy Against Rights
- Title 18, U.S.C., Section 242- Deprivation of Rights under Color of Law
- Title 42, U.S.C., Section 14141 Pattern and Practice
- Mississippi Code § 97-1-7 (2) Attempted Murder Statute
- Mississippi § 97-3-53 Kidnapping
- Mississippi Code § 97-3-7 (2)(a)- Aggravated Assault
- Mississippi Code § 97-3-95 Attempted Sexual Battery
- Mississippi Code § 97-1-1 (2018) (a)- Criminal Conspiracy
- Other state criminal statutes

Honorable Assistant Attorney General Kristen Clark, this specific case of police brutality and torture against Michael Jenkins and Eddie Parker is rapidly becoming known as one of the most notorious police brutality occurrences in this modern era, if not ever. Due to its peculiar facts and circumstances, this case qualifies as a D.O.J. Manual 8-3.130, *Case of National Interest*, and a DOJM Manual *High Profile Civil Rights Case*.

At no point were these African American victims running, resisting, or obstructing law enforcement in any way. If not for a miracle, Michael Corey Jenkins would be another dead victim of police brutality. The Rankin County, Mississippi deputies who committed state and federal hate crimes against Michael Corey Jenkins and Eddie Terrell Parker must be held accountable if the rule of law exists in Mississippi and the United States of America. Our plea, and the public demand, is that all rogue Rankin County deputies be swiftly indicted, arrested, and brought to justice.

As with the 1955 case of Emmett Till, we call on the federal government. Local and state actors will terrorize with hate and impunity if the federal government does not hold them accountable.
