Question 1 - Would establish an additional 4% state income tax on individuals with taxable incomes in excess of \$1 million. Revenues from this tax would be used for public education, public colleges, and universities as well as for the repair and maintenance of roads, bridges, and public transportation.	59%	33%	8%
Question 2 - Would regulate dental insurance rates, including by requiring companies to spend at least 83% of premiums on member dental expenses and quality improvements instead of administrative expenses, and by making other changes to dental insurance regulations.	68%	20%	12%
Question 3 - Would increase the statewide limit on the combined number of licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption that any one retailer could own or control.	39%	38%	23%
