
Mapping the Road to Freedom From . . .



- Carver Colored School
- St. James AUMP Church
- Mt. Calvary AME
- Howard Cooper Memorial Marker
- Pleasant Rest Cemetery (African American Cemetery)
- Mt Olive Baptist Church
- Community formerly known as Sandy Bottom
- The Pride of Towson Lodge
- Goucher College's Hallowed Ground Project
- Hampton Historic Site's slave quarters, overseer's house, spring house and the mansion




Trail Benefits
