Late last night, we were informed of a tragic accident involving one of our incoming Peoples Academy 9th grade students, Benjamin Clapp. This is heartbreaking news and will have a profound impact on our students, families, and staff. Ben was a bright light and connected with children and adults throughout all of our towns. Our hearts go out to his family during this very difficult time. Many will be impacted by this event and it is a time to lean on the power of our supportive tight-knit community. Below we have included resources to help navigate conversations with youth and peers.

We are available to address the many emotions, concerns, and questions that will arise over the coming days and weeks. Lamoille South has a School Crisis Team made up of professionals trained to help at difficult times such as this. There are many supports available for students, staff, and families. Those supports will include a time to connect **tomorrow** (**Friday**) at **4:00 p.m.** at Peoples Academy. The gymnasium and library will be open and counselors will be available for anyone interested in speaking with a mental health professional. Lamoille County Mental Health will be partnering with us throughout this process. This is also a time to just be together for those that would like to connect.
