NARRATIVE:

On or about Sunday, November 19, 2022 at about 12:44 AM, Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office Road Patrol Deputies were dispatched to [REDACTED] regarding a shooting. Upon arrival, Deputies located two shooting victims, Thomas Murvin a.k.a "JAY LANE", Date of Birth, November 01, 2003. The second victim was identified as [REDACTED] Date of Birth: February 09, 1989. After Deputies arrived on scene, Palm Beach County Fire Rescue subsequently responded and assisted them. Because of the serious nature of the gunshots wounds they respective sustained, both Thomas Murvin and [REDACTED] were immediately rushed to St. Mary's Medical Center. As [REDACTED] was being rushed to St. Mary's Medical Center, he was pronounced dead in the ambulance. Once Thomas Murvin arrived at the hospital, he was rushed into surgery for a gunshot wound to the torso.

During the autopsy, the Palm Beach County Medical Examiner discovered [REDACTED] sustained a single gunshot wound to the torso. As the result of the gunshot wound, [REDACTED] death was ruled a homicide. While performing the autopsy, the forensic pathologist recovered a single projectile/bullet from [REDACTED] chest area. The projectile/bullet recovered from [REDACTED] was scientifically determined to be .45 caliber. Further examination during the autopsy highlighted [REDACTED] had what appeared to be a defect to his genitals. The defect on the genitals is consistent with the firearm being held or positioned in a downward angle, as its being fired. There were fresh wounds and abrasions to [REDACTED] hands, suggestive of him being engaged in a recent violent physical struggle or fight.

In the immediate area encompassing the homicide scene, Detectives and Crime Scene Investigators recovered seven .45 caliber expended cartridge casings. The .45 caliber expended cartridge casings were resting in the roadway parallel to [REDACTED]. From [REDACTED] Road, the .45 caliber expended cartridge casings recovered at the scene, measured between 30' to 80'.

A black in color, .45 caliber Springfield Armory XDS semiautomatic pistol, serial number S3313901, was recovered along the roadway, resting in front of 442 North Coconut Road. The investigation highlighted 442 North Coconut Road is located [REDACTED]. Measurements established the .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol was about 90' from [REDACTED]. An examination and inspection of the .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol confirmed it was damp, blemished with dirt, and the chamber and magazine was empty. Based on its condition, it was clear the .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol was impacted or contaminated by the outside elements. The high capacity magazine inserted in the .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol display overt numeric markings, indicating it had the capacity to hold seven live rounds.

NARRATIVE CONTINUATION

Based on the placement of the .45 caliber expended cartridge casings and the .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol, when considered with the probable trajectory, the physical evidence is indicative of the shooter, moving west, while discharging the firearm back towards [REDACTED]. Multiple vehicles resting in front of [REDACTED] were impacted by gunfire. Additionally, the exterior structure and windows affixed to [REDACTED] sustained significant damage, resulting from gunfire.

Detectives and Crime Scene Investigators located and recovered projectiles consistent .45 caliber(s) from vehicles resting in front of [REDACTED] and from windows affixed to [REDACTED]. The projectiles embedded in the cars and windows aligned perfectly with the probable trajectory, when measured from the location of the expended cartridge casings.

A second firearm identified as a 300 Blackout American Tactical Model Omni Hybrid semiautomatic pistol, serial number NS360875 was recovered from within the crime scene. An inspection and examination of the 300 Blackout highlighted there was an expended cartridge casing still lodged into the ejection port. This physical evidence establishes the 300 Blackout was actually discharged at the scene however the cartridge casing failed to eject.

While at the scene, Detectives interviewed cooperating witness #1 who articulated while inside his/her residence, approximately 7-8 gunshots could be heard resonating from outside. According to cooperating witness #1, he or she could hear the gunshots striking the building. Cooperating witness #1 currently lives at or near [REDACTED]. Seconds after the gunshots, cooperating witness #1 immediately came outside and observed [REDACTED] running towards [REDACTED]. Cooperating witness #1 later learned [REDACTED] was shot and collapsed once he entered [REDACTED]. As he or she looked further south, cooperating witness #1 noticed Thomas Murvin lying on southwest corner of [REDACTED] suffering from a gunshot wound. At the time, Thomas Murvin was in possession of the previously mentioned 300 Blackout. Thomas Murvin was dressed in a black hooded sweatshirt with some type of apparel covering his face. As he or she was administering first aid, Thomas Murvin began to complain of signs of paralysis.

In the preliminary stages of the investigation, Detectives learned from the medical staff at St. Mary's Medical Center, Thomas Murvin was paralyzed from the waist down. Subsequently, a .45 caliber projectile/bullet was removed from Thomas Murvin's torso area.

Senior Forensic Scientist from the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office Firearms Unit scientifically concluded the .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol recovered at the scene was scientifically linked to the expended cartridge casings recovered at the scene and the .45 caliber projectiles/bullets removed from [REDACTED] and Thomas Murvin. Essentially, the .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol recovered at the scene fired the projectiles/bullets removed from [REDACTED] and Thomas Murvin and fired the seven expended cartridge casings recovered in the roadway. Additionally, the aforesaid .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol was scientifically linked to a projectile/bullet recovered from a Chevrolet Tahoe, parked in front of [REDACTED]. Due to significant damage and distortion to the remaining projectiles/bullets recovered at the scene, ballistics analysis was unable to render any conclusive results.

As the investigation continued, Detectives procured video surveillance evidence from a surveillance camera located in the immediate area of the homicide scene. This specific surveillance camera was affixed to 429 North Coconut Road. This building is located about 30' east of [REDACTED]. While reviewing the surveillance footage, Detectives observed the following. At about 12:10 AM, November 19, 2022 (30 minutes before the homicide), the surveillance camera captures a vehicle later determined to be a 2016, 2-DR, Aluminum/Silver, Nissan Frontier, as it arrives and backs into the parking space in front of 429 North Coconut Road. Once the silver Nissan truck parks, two males are captured by surveillance cameras exiting the truck. The first male was dressed in what appeared to be long black pants, a black hooded sweatshirt, and black shoes with noticeable white trim encompassing the entire base. At the time, the surveillance camera captures this individual armed with what appeared to be a rifle. The second subject was determined to be a white male,

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dressed in long black pants, with a noticeable white stripe and lettering or some type of patterns, extended along both pant legs. Both subjects are captured by surveillance cameras as they stealthy and surreptitiously, walk from the silver Nissan truck, north along the east side of 429 North Cocoanut Road. Once they were on the north side of 429 North Cocoanut Road, both subjects appear to walk west towards the north side of [REDACTED]. From the northwest side of [REDACTED] but subjects had an unobstructed view, giving them a direct line of site to the residence where [REDACTED] was living. A few minutes later, they return to the silver Nissan truck and drive away. Based on the video surveillance evidence, it appeared these subjects were stalking [REDACTED].

When Thomas Murvin was located at the homicide scene, at about 12:46 AM, November 19, 2022, he was dressed identical to the subject captured on video at 12:10 AM, November 19, 2022, exiting the front passenger seat of the silver Nissan truck, armed with the rifle. Consistent with the subject captured by surveillance cameras, Thomas Murvin was dressed in long black pants, black hooded sweatshirt, and black shoes with noticeable white trim encompassing entire base. Through evidence recovered at the scene, Detectives established Thomas Murvin was wearing a pair of black patent leather Air Jordan 11's, with white trim encompassing the base of the shoes. In addition, Thomas Murvin is similar in build, gait, and overall body stature, to the suspect observed exiting the silver Nissan truck from the passenger side. The white male suspect was driving the silver Nissan Truck.

In a sworn digitally recovered interview, Thomas Murvin told Detectives while standing in front of [REDACTED] he heard multiple gunshots and realized he was shot. Because he was looking down at his mobile device, he didn't see the suspects. Before Thomas Murvin was transported to St. Mary's Medical Center, his clothing was removed from his person. During a meticulous canvass of the area, search of his clothing, and walk-thru of the scene, no mobile device associated with Thomas Murvin was recovered.

The investigation established shortly after the shooting transpired, at about 01:00 AM, November 19, 2022, Deputies encountered Larry Dunnon walking along McClure Road near Ricky Jackson Boulevard, which is about .25 miles from the homicide scene. During this encounter, Deputies observed Larry Dunnon was extremely wet and dirty. In a sworn digitally recorded interview with Detectives, Larry Dunnon articulated shortly before the shooting, his girlfriend drove him to [REDACTED] to purchase Marijuana from an individual name Jay. Before the encounter, he communicated with Jay via mobile device to establish a predetermined location. In the midst of the drug transaction, Larry Dunnon could hear shots resonating in the area. In fear, Larry Dunnon articulated he ran west and proceeded to hide in a small canal. Originally, Larry Dunnon articulated he thought he was running through bushes or hedges and wasn't aware a small canal was in his path. Larry Dunnon remained in the canal for approximately five minutes. Once the shooting discontinued, he emerged from the canal and was later stopped by responding Deputies. To the best of his recollection, he remembers hearing about three to four gunshots in rapid succession. Larry Dunnon was unable to provide the name of the female friend who drove him to the incident location.

Directly along the path where Larry Dunnon articulated he ran, Detectives and Crime Scene Investigators recovered the aforesaid .45 caliber expended cartridge casings. The progression of the expended cartridge casings (east to west) is the same direction Larry Dunnon ran. More importantly, the aforesaid .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol, was located about 15'-20' from the exact location where the investigation established Larry Dunnon went into the canal.

In a subsequent post miranda interview, Larry Dunnon articulated he arrived at the homicide scene in a silver Nissan Truck. After arriving, he was dropped off in the silver Nissan Truck somewhere in the street, near 435 North Cocoanut Road. When asked, Larry Dunnon was conflicted about the model of the silver Nissan truck. Before driving to the area of the incident location, he sent a text message to Jay to establish a location to meet for the drug transaction. According to Larry Dunnon, the only information he had for the marijuana dealer was he knew him by the name "JAY". Because Larry Dunnon originally articulated to Detectives, his girlfriend was the person who drove him over to [REDACTED] he was asked if it was his current girlfriend. Initially, Larry Dunnon replied yes, then he added, "WELL I HAVE A SIDE CHICK TOO". Once he was

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dropped off, the female was supposed to return to pick him up. During the drug transaction, he overheard gunshots and immediately fled from the area.

For investigative purposes, Detectives continued the investigation by interviewing cooperating witness #2 who articulated the following. Sworn testimony was provided highlighting Thomas Murvin procured possession of the aforesaid silver Nissan truck sometime after 10:30 PM, November 18, 2022. Cooperating Witness #2 personally observed Thomas Murvin and a subject later positively identified as Drake Hamilton, white male, date of birth, March 28, 2003, in possession of the aforesaid silver Nissan truck. At the time, sworn testimony was provided highlighting Drake Hamilton and Thomas Murvin were aware the .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol was in the silver Nissan truck. Additional sworn testimony was provided highlighting about 5-6 minutes before the homicide, Larry Dunnon drove by [REDACTED]. Surveillance cameras verified this happened at about 12:34 AM, November 19, 2022. Shortly after turning around and driving away from [REDACTED] [REDACTED] sworn testimony was provided highlighting how Larry Dunnon exited the vehicle he occupied at the time. Larry Dunnon advised he was waiting in the area to meet with Thomas Murvin, who was driving the silver Nissan truck.

About five minutes later around 12:39 AM, November 19, 2022, surveillance cameras from 429 North Cocoanut Road and [REDACTED] captures the aforesaid silver Nissan truck driving west on North Cocoanut Road towards the homicide scene. Shortly thereafter is when the 911 call is made reporting the shooting and Larry Dunnon is later stopped by Deputies walking from the area of the homicide scene. Subsequently, around or after 02:00 AM, November 19, 2022, information was received articulating how Larry Dunnon directed witnesses to the subject who was in possession of the keys to the silver Nissan truck. Drake Hamilton was determined to be in possession of the keys to the silver Nissan truck and the location of the truck, was determined to be parked only a short distance from a residence where Drake Hamilton was staying in Pahokee, Florida.

In a post miranda interview on December 03, 2022, Drake Hamilton denied any involvement or complicity in the homicide or incident that transpired on November 19, 2022, at [REDACTED]. Drake Hamilton articulated he was familiar with the homicide because his friend Thomas Murvin (Jay Lane) was shot. The night of November 18, 2022 into November 19, 2022, Drake Hamilton denied being an occupant inside the aforesaid silver Nissan truck. That particular day and night, Drake Hamilton said he was nowhere in Pahokee, Florida. He speculated he was somewhere in Port St. Lucie, Florida or West Palm Beach, Florida. Drake Hamilton is similar in build and stature to the white male suspect captured by surveillance cameras at 12:10 AM, November 19, 2022, when the Nissan truck initially arrives at 429 North Cocoanut Road. During the interview, Detectives confronted Drake Hamilton with images lawfully recovered from his mobile device, capturing him in possession of the aforesaid 300 Blackout. These images were from October 30, 2022, November 15, 2022, and November 16, 2022. The investigation established the individual who purchased the aforesaid 300 Blackout on October 20, 2022, is close friends with Drake Hamilton and Thomas Murvin.

On the same date of the post miranda interview, December 03, 2022, Detectives executed a lawful search warrant on the residence where Drake Hamilton was living in Wellington, Florida. While searching the room Drake Hamilton occupied, Detectives recovered a pair of long black pants, with a noticeable white stripe and patterns along the side of the pants leg. These pants were identical to the pants the white male suspect was captured by surveillance cameras wearing when the silver Nissan truck initially arrives at 12:10 AM, November 19, 2022(30 minutes before the homicide), to stake out the area.

Pursuant to a lawful search warrant, Detectives procured the historical cellular site location information for the mobile device associated with Drake Hamilton. Close to the time of the homicide, the historical cellular site location information establishes the mobile device associated with Drake Hamilton was facilitating transmissions through cellular sites and sectors indicative of the mobile device operating in Pahokee, Florida. The geolocation data does not support the information Drake Hamilton provided during his interview. Furthermore, the geolocation data corroborates sworn testimony provided during the investigation, chronicling Drake Hamilton's whereabouts and movements, in the hours and minutes, leading up to the homicide.

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At 02:13 AM, November 19, 2022, the Instagram account associated with Drake Hamilton forwards multiple messages to the Instagram associated with Thomas Murvin inquiring about his whereabouts.

Based on sworn testimony and evidence uncovered during the investigation, Detectives established Drake Hamilton was driving the silver Nissan truck at the time of the homicide. He was accompanied by Thomas Murvin and Larry Dunnon, who were respectively armed with a .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol and 300 Blackout. The evidence uncovered during the investigation established the information Larry Dunnon provided about the drug transaction was completely false. Evidence establishes, Larry Dunnon lied to Detectives to explain his presence at the homicide scene. As articulated earlier, Larry Dunnon's accomplice, Thomas Murvin's moniker is "JAY LANE", and according to witnesses who live at [REDACTED] and in the surrounding buildings, there is no "JAY" that lives there. Again, the evidence established Larry Dunnon, Thomas Murvin, and Drake Hamilton drove over together in the aforesaid silver Nissan truck to shoot and kill [REDACTED]

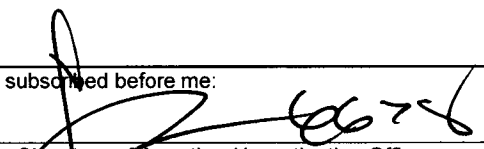
The physical evidence and forensic evidence recovered at the scene was consistent with Larry Dunnon firing the .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol as he is moving east to west, towards the small canal. While shooting back towards [REDACTED] the evidence establishes he shot [REDACTED] and accidentally shot his accomplice, Thomas Murvin.

The DNA results received on February 17, 2023, highlighted the following. When analysis was done on the swabs from the Body/Frame, Slide, and Sights of the Spring Field Armory .45-caliber semiautomatic pistol, a DNA profile was obtained illustrating very strong support for Thomas Murvin. Other aspects or areas of the .45 caliber semiautomatic pistol didn't yield any DNA results due to the complex nature of the DNA mixture, the DNA is unsuitable for comparison.

The investigation established Johnny Worthens, a relative and close friend of Larry Dunnon, Thomas Murvin, and Drake Hamilton, was reported missing, under suspicious circumstances, in September of the year 2022. Currently, Johnny Worthens is presumed to be dead. It was rumored, [REDACTED] was complicit in his mysterious disappearance therefore the investigation established he was killed in retaliation.

A background investigation and criminal history check highlighted Thomas Murvin is prohibited from owning or possession firearms.
