Details:

On 9-29-09 at approximately 0743 hours, Reserve Officer Roldan and myself responded to a reported suspicious circumstance at 1920 Silverwood Ave. in Mtn.View.

While enroute to the scene, M.V.P.D. Communications updated that the reporting party (Doe #1 stated that approximately two hours earlier, one to two male subjects entered her residence wearing ski masks and asked her identity theft related questions. M.V.P.D. Communications also advised that the subjects had left the area approximately 10 minutes earlier.

While enroute to the scene, I immediately observed two Hispanic male subjects, who were walking nearby in the area, northbound on the east sidewalk of Sierra Vista Ave., south of Montecito Avenue. As a result, I contacted the two subjects and explained to them that an incident occurred down the street, and that they possibly matched the description of the suspect.

Ofc. Wong responded to the scene, and stood by with the two subjects while I attempted to contact Doe #1 at her residence.

Upon my arrival at the scene, Ofc.Mello and Lt.Sousa were speaking with Doe #1 inside the residence. She appeared calm, composed and not distraught. I contacted Doe #1 and told her that I had two subjects who were detained nearby, and asked if she was willing to conduct an infield show up to determine if they were the same suspects who were involved in the incident.

She agreed to participate in the in field show up. Prior to transporting Doe #1 to the location where the two subjects were detained, I admonished her that the two subjects who were detained may or may not have been the same suspect or suspects related to the incident. I further admonished her to keep an open mind, and to not feel pressured regarding making an identification of the subjects. I further stated that the system is designed to free the innocent as well as to locate the suspect(s) involved. I asked her if she understood the admonishment and she stated, "Yeah."

I then transported her to the area where the subjects were detained on on the east sidewalk of Sierra Vista Ave., south of Montecito Avenue. Doe #1 was seated in the rear of patrol vehicle #3018, and viewed both subjects from a distance of approximately 30-50 feet away. She viewed both subjects and stated that she

didn't believe either of them was the suspect because their clothing was completely different, and she thought the suspect was taller and white, while the subjects being detained were shorter and Hispanic.

As a result, at my request, Ofc. Wong immediately released both subjects at the scene. I then transported back to her residence.

While at the scene, I examined the interior of the residence. 1920 Silverwood is a two story, single family residence, located on the southeast corner of a townhouse complex. The front door to the residence is located on the west side. There is a downstairs glass sliding door, located on the south side of the residence. A stairway is located inside the residence, south of the front (west) door. The stairway leads to the upstairs bedroom, which is located on the south side of the second floor. There is an upstairs glass sliding door, located on the south side of the upstairs bedroom, which leads to the outside balcony.

While at the residence, I spoke with Doe #1 who did not request confidentiality, and provided the following paraphrased statement:

STATEMENT OF Doe #1, Jane

She stated that she went to bed on 9-29-09 at approximately midnight. Prior to going to bed, she consumed a single glass of wine, and was not intoxicated as a result. She later fell asleep on her bed, with her upstairs bedroom glass sliding door open and unsecured.

At approximately 0500 hours, she felt something on her back, as she was was lying face down in her bed. She initially believed the objects on her back were her two cats. She then realized that something heavy, such as a person was on her back. She then heard a male voice tell her "stop screaming, stop screaming, or I'll hurt you." The suspect then told her to "calm down," and that it was a "robbery."

She stated that at the time, she was screaming, but she didn't think anyone could have heard her, because her face was in her pillow, which was possibly muffling the sound.

The suspect then told her to remain calm, and that he was actually there for identity theft purposes and not a robbery. He later told her that he needed to wire money offshore in order to conduct some sort of fraudulent activity, however he couldn't do it until the banks opened on the east coast.

The suspect then told her to place her hands behind her back. She did and the suspect handcuffed her. The suspect then placed some sort of velcro restraint around her ankles, in order to further restrict her movement.

At one point, she looked back and saw what she thought was a male subject, wearing tight fitting, all black clothing. She said the suspect was wearing a black cotton type ski mask, which had cut outs for the two eyes and mouth.

The suspect also spoke without an accent, and as a result she believed he was a white male. She thought that he was approximately six feet tall with a slender build, however she was not sure.

She described him as being nerdy or "geeky," because he asked her technical questions about her computer, such as if her D.S.L. was dynamic or static.

She stated the entire incident lasted for approximately two hours. During the incident, the suspect attempted to access her computer, but couldn't figure out how to turn it on.

He also went downstairs and she could hear him speaking to someone, however she could only hear his voice, so she believed he was possibly speaking on the telephone.

She initially thought that there were possibly two suspects involved, because at one point when the suspect was speaking with her, she could hear the floor creaking nearby in the hallway or another room, as if someone was walking on it, however she couldn't confirm it.

She also said that during the incident, she felt disoriented, confused, and surreal, as if it was a dream, however she stated that she was sure it was not a dream.

She stated that at one point, when she was upstairs, she moved or wiggled her feet, and the noise from the velcro alerted the suspect that she was moving. As a result, he told her not to move anymore.

She didn't see any weapons during the incident, and the suspect did harm her or threaten her. She also said that he appeared polite.

At one point, the suspect placed a black mask or goggles over her eyes, while she was still handcuffed with her legs restrained. He then carried her downstairs, by placing one hand under her neck, and the other under her legs. He placed her in a seated position downstairs, and began making telephone calls to an unknown subject. She didn't remember the exact details of the conversation at the time.

As Doe #1 was showing me how the suspect was carrying her down the stairs, she motioned that her wrists were handcuffed in front of her. I asked her to confirm if her hands were in front of her or behind her, since she originally told me that the suspect handcuffed her hands behind her back.

She then thought about it, and stated that at some point, the suspect unhandcuffed her and then placed the handcuffs on her, with her hands in front and then later removed the handcuffs and handcuffed her again, with her hands behind her back. She was unable to recall or articulate the exact details of where or when the suspect removed the handcuffs, repositioned them to her front, and then again behind her back.

The suspect then carried her back upstairs and placed her on top of her bed. He then told her that he had some bad news, and it was that he going to rape her. She asked him if he had a condom, and then plead with him several times not to rape her. As a result, he told her that he wouldn't.

During the incident, the suspect retrieved Doe #1 s Blackberry and began scrolling through the contacts, asking her who each person was, as if he was looking at it for identity theft purposes.

He then asked her what time she normally goes to work, and told her that he would send her boss a text message for her on her Blackberry, stating that she was sick.

He then sent her boss a text message stating that she had the Swine Flu and that she wouldn't be in today. Her boss responded shortly thereafter and told her that it was okay.

The suspect also told her that he had planted evidence in the residence, however he didn't provide any further details, and she wasn't exactly sure, what he was referring too.

He also told her that he had removed the batteries from her telephones and didn't tell her where he put them.

Prior to the suspect leaving the residence, he provided her with some crime prevention tips. He told her that in the future, in order to alleviate any similar incidents, that she should get a dog, or secure her doors and windows at night.

The suspect then unhandcuffed her and directed her to stay in the room. He then left the room in an unknown direction. She was not sure if he was still there or not, however after waiting approximately 10-15 minutes and not hearing any noise, she decided to call the police, however all of the batteries for her telephones were missing. As a result, she utilized an old rotary dial up telephone that she had, in order to call the police to report the incident.

Doe #1 stated that she was not in fear of her life during the incident, and had not seen any suspicious persons or activity in the area. She had no idea who the suspect was, or how he entered her residence.

Doe #1 stated that at some point during the incident, the suspect made her drink a small amount of what she thought was "Nyquil." She was unsure of exactly what he made her drink, or the exact quantity, however she believed it was the same amount as in a small energy drink, which could be purchased at a convenience store or 7-11. She was unable to provide any further details or information related to the consumption of the liquid.

She believed that she locked the front (west) door prior to the incident, and confirmed that her upstairs balcony glass sliding window was open at the time. She was not sure if her downstairs glass sliding window located on the south side of the residence was locked or not, when she went to bed.

I observed both the upstairs and downstairs interior of the residence, and noticed that it appeared well kept and not disheveled.

Lalso examined Doe #1's hands and wrists and noticed some faint red marks on her wrists, which appeared consistent with having handcuffs on her wrists. She stated that she was not injured and declined medical attention. While at the scene, Agt. Shueh took photographs of the marks on Doe #1's wrists.

I checked the back patio area downstairs, which could have possibly been a point of entry, if the door was left unsecured, however I did not notice any footprints from the suspect. There was a small vase or pot lying in

the grass on the backyard, which Doe #1 later stated was inside her house on the kitchen table, prior to going to bed the previous evening. Community Service Officer Thrower later responded to the scene, and processed the item for fingerprints, however was unable to locate any.

C.S.O. Thrower also took photographs of the scene, and processed the front (west) door, ground level sliding door, as well as the upstairs balcony door for fingerprints, however he was unable to locate any.

While inside the residence, I observed three telephones, which were placed on top of the kitchen table. Two of the telephones were cordless telephones for the landline, and one was Doe #1 s Blackberry cellular telephone. All three of the telephones were missing the batteries from the battery compartments.

With Doe #1 s consent, C.S.O. Thrower collected the two cordless telephones and the cellular Blackberry and transported them to the M.V.P.D. for fingerprint processing. C.S.O. Thrower dusted the telephones for fingerprints, however was unable to locate any.

While at the scene, Lt. Sousa, Sgt. Leal and Det. Solomon attempted to locate any witnesses in the surrounding complex. Lt. Sousa later directed my attention to a subject (Barrella, who lived in the residence, just north of Doe #1 at 1926 Silverwood Avenue. Barrella had told Lt. Sousa that she had seen something suspicious earlier in the morning.

As a result, I contacted B at her residence, and she provided the following paraphrased statement:

STATEMENT OF B

She stated that she lives next door to Doe #1 at 1926 Silverwood Avenue. She said they are neighbors, and casual friends, and she recently watched Doe #1 s cats for her while she was out of town.

On 9-29-09 at approximately 0500-0515 hours, she (Electron) was up using the bathroom. At this time, she was upstairs and could see into Doe #1 s upstairs (bathroom) window, which was located on the north side of the residence.

During this time, she noticed what appeared to have been a flashlight moving around inside the north upstairs room of Doe #1 s apartment. She was unsure of the size of the flashlight, however she thought it was a small pen light type as it motioned around inside the room. She could almost faintly make out an image of the person who was holding the light, however she was unable to do so.

She figured it was Doe #1 inside the residence, and was wondering why she didn't turn on a light instead of using a flashlight. Believing the subject with the flashlight was Doe #1 she didn't call 9-1-1 or investigate the incident any further.

I later spoke with Doe #1, who confirmed that she does have a flashlight, however she didn't use it during the time frame in question. She showed me her flashlight, which was a large Maglite type, although its batteries were quite faded.

During the course of my investigation, I asked Doe #1 if she is taking any kind of medications, or has any history of psychological illness. She stated that the only medication she was taking were birth control pills, and stated that she had no psychological problems.

She stated that she has a boyfriend (W) who lives in Belmont. She spoke with W the previous evening, and everything was fine in their relationship. They have dated for approximately four to five years and do not live together. She stated that W had nothing to do with the incident, and knew nothing about, as she had not even told him about it at the time.

I asked Doe #1 if she was willing come to the M.V.P.D. in order to allow us to obtain a blood sample, since the suspect made her drink an unknown liquid, which she believed was possibly Nyquil.

She stated that she was willing. I provided her the option of driving herself and meeting me at the M.V.P.D., or I could transport her in the back of my patrol car. She requested that I provide her with the transport. As a result, Reserve Ofc.Roldan and myself transported Doe #1 to the M.V.P.D. I.S.D interview room #1.

Technician Espinosa responded and obtained a sample of Doe #1's blood. Technician Espinosa took custody of the sample, and Reserve Ofc.Roldan and myself transported Doe #1' back to her residence.

While at the M.V.P.D., Det.Solomon examined Doe #1 's Blackberry and located a text message, which was sent on 9-29-09 at 0600 hours to Doe #1's employer (The message stated that she had been up all night with a fever and was not going to be at work today.

I later spoke with Doe #1 and she reiterated that she didn't send the message from her telephone, and stated that the suspect did instead.

Det. Solomon also located what appeared to have been a text message that was either to or from the Viagra Corporation, during the same time frame. I later asked Doe #1 if the she had sent any text messages to the Viagra corporation. She stated that she had not. She did state that for unknown reasons, she frequently receives text messages from them on her Blackberry.

After Det.Solomon was finished examining the contents on the Blackberry, and C.S.O. Thrower completed processing of all of the telephones, Res.Ofc.Roldan and myself returned the telephones back to Doe #1 at her residence.

On 9-30-09, I checked my City voice mail prior to my shift. I had received a message from Doe #1 after my shift was over the previous day. She had stated something to the effect that she had noticed two screens, which had appeared to have been removed on the back side of her residence, along with a ladder nearby. She requested that I respond and examine the scene, and possibly dust for fingerprints.

I attempted to call her back on the telephone number she provided me with, however she was not there. I left a voice message requesting she call me back. Res.Ofc.Roldan and myself responded to her residence and

Officer Mello was first to arrive on scene at 0745 hours and I followed shortly thereafter at 0747 hours. There was a City maintenance truck parked on the street in front and Officer Mello had a short conversation with the Hispanic male City employee outside before we drove into the comlex and then headed in on foot.

Officer Mello knocked on the front door and approximately 20-seconds later, Doe #1 came to the door. There is a glass cut out(s) at the top of the door and I could see Doe #1 descend the stairs. We both were in uniform and verbally identified ourselves as the Mountain View Police. I heard her unchain the door and turn the knob. Doe #1 then opened the door.

Officer Mello said we were responding to her call and asked if we could come in. We entered and she closed the door. Officer Mello checked the interior of the residence. I spoke to Henry briefly. She stated to me, and soon to Officer Mello who rejoined me, that she had been sleeping in bed when the suspect jumped on her back. She explained that at first she thought it was her cats but quickly figured out it was a person based on the weight.

Doe #1 stated she was handcuffed, bound, and ordered to provide personal information. I asked if she had screamed. She said intially her face was in the pillow and she tried but maybe it was muffled.

At 0751 hours, Officer Taylor and Reserve Officer Roldan came to the door. After conversing with them, I went outside to check the complex. I made contact with the female resident exiting 1924 Silverwood Avenue. After advising her we were investigating a suspicious incident with a possible intruder, she stated she had not noted anything or heard any screaming. She did note they often have problems with transients walking through the complex.

After speaking with her, I saw B leaning out of her downstairs sliding glass door and it was clear she wanted to tell me something. B said she was just contacted "by the guys in the suits" (Sgt. Leal and Detective Solomon) but she wanted to tell me too.

I asked her if she had heard any screaming this morning. She explain the people associated with the nearby church "speak in tongues" and often do so from a loud speaker starting at 0500-0600 hours. Although she had not heard it today, perhaps that was the screaming I was asking about.

I told her we were at her neighbor's at 1920. Beautiful appeared startled and asked if we were at " I told her we were. B said had to get dressed and "give her comfort." I was talking to B through the door and it appeared she was wearing night clothes. I told her to let the police officers do their jobs and she could talk to them when they were done. B asked when the incident occurred. I said at about 0500-0700 hours.

said she did notice something "weird". She got up to use the restroom at 0500 hours. The looked out and saw what appeared to be the light from a small flashlight bathroom is upstairs and B in Doe #1 s upstairs window. But said the light was moving about within the room which she felt was

On 10/6/09 at approximately 1316 hours Lt. Sato and I met with the victim (V1) in this case to obtain information in regards to her daily routine, the places she frequents and the people she spends time with.

I explained to V1 that one of the motives we were currently investigating was similar to stalking and that it was important for us to determine her daily routine, work routine and social routine. I explained that we felt the suspect may be someone she had come into contact with and someone she possibly knew, someone who was involved in her life somewhere. Lt. Sato and I also explained that the suspect in this case could have also committed a random act in this event and she wasn't a specific target but a random one.

V1 asked about the blood test that was taken from her and if any results had come back. I explained that it normally takes 6 to 8 weeks before the lab results would come back. After explaining the goals of the interview V1 asked about her personal safety and what our feelings were. I explained that she needed to take all possible precautions and offered the assistance of Mountain View Police Department's Community Action and Information Unit. V1 and I discussed the benefits of her getting in touch with Victim's assistance and the potential for a security system being installed at her home.

I asked V1 to tell me about her normal day and to start at the time she normally wakes up. V1 said she didn't have a normal routine. She said she normally tried to get to work at 0800 hrs. which meant that she normally woke up around 0700 hrs. She said there were some nights of the week that she spent the night at her boyfriend Christian's house and was not at home. V1 said she spent the night at Christian's house

V1 said she usually spent Sunday and Thursday nights at her boyfriend Christian's home or he spent the night at her house on those nights of the week. V1 said at times she and Christian spent Monday night together since they swam together on Tuesday mornings for a work out. She said on those Monday nights she and her boyfriend would usually spend the night at her house since the places they swam were closer to her home.

V1 said that during the week (Tuesdays and Thursdays) she or she and Christian would swim at Rinconada Swim club in Palo Alto. She said on the weekends (Saturday and Sunday) she usually would swim at Eagle Park on Shoreline Blvd. in Mountain View. She said she and Christian just started going to a pool at Burlingame High School on Sundays.

V1 said on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays she would work out at her Gym at work during her lunch hour or go for a run in the area around her work in Redwood City (a four mile loop (down to the end of sea court or C Court and back).

I asked V1 to again clarify her arrival time at work and she said there were times if she was busy she would get into work at 0700 hrs. and if she was feeling unmotivated she might get into work around 0900 hrs. V1 said she doesn't stop for coffee or breakfast anywhere. She said she eats breakfast and makes her coffee at home prior to going to work.

I asked V1 about her activities after work and she said at least two times a week she would meet Christian for dinner and a drink after work. She said she and Christian went out to dinner "a lot". V1 said she and Christian would take the kids to a burger place called the Canyon Inn in Redwood City off of Jefferson, at least once or twice a week.

V1 said she and Christian didn't have a specific place where they would go out for drinks. She said she and Christian would vary the places they went out for drinks, usually somewhere in Menlo Park, or Redwood City. She said that she and Christian didn't go to lunch very regularly and didn't have any specific breakfast locations they frequented.

V1 said there were times she and Christian went to a piano bar in San Mateo on 25th Ave. called the "Swinging Door". At one point they went there at least once a week. She said the bartender is a women and that Christian was friends with the owner (a Male) who knows her by sight.

V1 said that she has known Christian for over ten years and they have been going out for approximately four years. She said they used to work together.

V1 said she didn't have any girlfriends that she hung out with on a regular basis.

I asked V1 again about the places she went to swim. I asked her if there was ever anyone there who was helpful or friendly. She said she couldn't think of anyone and described herself as pretty much anti-social, didn't make eye contact with people and not the type of person to chat people up. I asked her about the goggles that she said the suspect put on her. She said they reminded her of swim goggles because of how the rubber strap got caught up in her hair when the suspect put them on her. She said the suspect had trouble placing them on her and described him as clumsy. She described them as fitting like swim goggles but she could see a little out the sides. Lt. Sato asked her how the goggles were blacked out and gave examples, asking if she thought they were painted or blacked out with something like a sharpy marker? V1 said her impression was that the goggles were blacked out with something like a piece of cardboard.

I asked V1 if there was ever a life guard at the pools and she said yes but they are never the same person, she doesn't really pay attention. She said it is usually some young kid. I asked her if the people at the people were regulars and she said yes there are people who are there consistently but nobody who raised alarms with her. She said everyone just seems like they are there to swim. She said it's the same at all three pools.

I asked V1 to pay attention to what is happening around her while she swims and during the day to see if she has any idea who may be paying attention to her. She said ever since the incident happened she feels like everyone is watching her.

I asked V1 about work. She said she thinks there is about fifteen people (employees) that she works with everyday. She said there are consultants that come in and out everyday. She said now she was "in a bad place" even when a Vice President from the company she has known for five years came to her just wanting her to know he was there for her, she felt uncomfortable with it. She said she now suspects everybody and doesn't feel like she has a good appraisal of people anymore.

Lt. Sato asked V1 about the suspect's voice and she said when he originally was controlling her with his body weight and handcuffing her he sounded like he was intentionally lowering his voice and making it raspy in an attempt to disguise it. She said when he was scrolling through her phone his voice sounded more natural. She said that is when he apparently come across an alumni e-mail from "Haas" and he asked her "oh you went to B school". She explained to us that Haas is the business school she attended at U. C. Berkley She thought it was odd that he knew Haas was U. C. Berkley's Business School.

I asked V1 where she grocery shopped and she said Trader Joes in Mountain View, and the Safeway on Shoreline Blvd. She said she was familiar with employees from both stores but nothing and no one unusual came to mind.

I asked V1 what veterinary clinic she used for her cats and she said she had only been one time. She said she went to a female Veterinarian (couldn't remember the name) at Adobe Vet hospital in Los Altos.

V1 said she goes every month to get a massage at "Massage Envy" the one in Mountain View on Grant Rd. (she has seen same male masseuse each time) and one in San Mateo on El Camino Real near Belmont. V1 said she went to another Massage Envy in Foster City the Thursday before the incident and the Masseuse was another male that spoke to her during the massage. She said the masseuse in Foster City had an accent unlike the suspect in this case.

V1 said there was a group of people that she went out with somewhat regularly. She said they were people that she worked with a few jobs prior to the one where she was currently working. She said they have known each other for years. I asked her if there were any men in the group and she said the group was mostly guys. She said the Friday before the incident she went out with two of the subjects from the group along with two of their co-workers, who she had never met before. I asked if during the conversation her academic degrees came up. She said she was making fun of MBA degrees and she told them she could do that since she had one.

I advised V1 that we would need her to start making a list of names of the people we were speaking about during this interview. I asked her to start compiling a list of these types of acquaintances in her life so that we could start conducting interviews.

I advised V1 that detectives would need to speak with her boyfriend Christian since he might be able to provide us with more ideas on possible suspects in the case and he might be able to remember or think of things she had not.

V1 said that her boyfriend Christian had some guy hack into his e-mail account (G-mail) and send him threatening e-mails approximately two months prior to the incident. She said Christian wanted to talk with us about it. He thought it may be related to her incident. V1 said her brother said he wouldn't mind coming in and being interviewed.

We discussed her schedule again and I confirmed that on Monday evenings she and Christian sometimes spent the night at her house on Silverwood. I asked her where Christian normally parked his car and she said

in the parking lot of her complex when he spent the night. At times when he was just there to pick her up or have dinner he would park in the court on Silverwood. We discussed the potential for the suspect being able to tell she was home since her car was parked in its normal parking stall. I also mentioned that a suspect who was familiar with her activities would probably know about Christian and when he was there by his vehicle being there. V1 said Christian had three cars that he drove.

V1 advised that Christian's family car was a hybrid. He had an old Police car that was converted to natural gas. She explained he had a difficult commute (Belmont to Newark) working as an engineer in Newark and two of the cars had stickers allowing him to use the HOV lane. She advised his third car was a 1969 Pontiac Firebird.

I asked V1 if she knew any of Christian's friends that were males she may have spent time with. She said she knew two of Christian's friends who were both guys. She said one of the guys went to dinner with her and Christian at the Canyon Inn. She said that that friend was also an engineer and he worked for a laser company near Oracle in Redwood Shores. She said his name was Randy Name She said Randy and Christian have known each other for approximately twenty years. She said Christian's other friend's name was Dave

I asked V1 if she ever attended a job related conference or trade show where she might have met or talked with anyone who could be a suspect. She said she attended one a week before the incident occurred. She said during the conference (trade show) she had dinner with a large group of people and may have discussed personal information.

*V1 said she didn't belong to any social networking web-sites. She said she did belong to a professional networking web site called <u>Linked In</u>. She said Linked In has her professional information, educational information and a picture. (I accessed Linked In and V1's picture, work address, college and degree information were all provided on her profile).

I asked V1 about when the suspect scrolled through the contacts in her cell phone. She said the suspect asked her who Christian W was a few times. She thought this was due to emails on her cell phone from Christian not because of the information in her contact list.

V1 said the suspect asked her about her parents and she told him her parents were deceased. She said the suspect asked her who Rob was and when she asked him Rob's last name he provided her bosses last name. She said she told the suspect Rob was her boss.

I asked V1 about doctors that she went to and she said all her doctors were females.

Lt. Sato asked V1 about her neighbors. She said she had no reason to think the suspect was one of her neighbors but the neighbor who lived on the bedroom side (south) of her house had lived there for about a year and kept odd hours. She said he had friends over late, played games and they were loud. She said that neighbor could see into her house. She said she has never seen anything to lead her to believe he was a problem. She confirmed the neighbor lived at 1960 Silverwood. She said the only other home near her she

didn't know about was 1918 Silverwood.

I asked V1 about gardeners and handy men. She said he had a new heating system put in last year but the guy who put the system in was tall (estimated 6'4"). She said he was an independent contractor names Clint W and described him as odd because he gave her lectures about fasting. She said he didn't do a very good job and the store she purchased the heating unit from sent a guy who was "very very French" over to finish the work. She said approximately three years prior she had someone come in and do electrical work. She didn't remember the name but could probably find the receipt.

She said a company from Los Altos put in new windows including her sliding glass doors (locked by a key) last winter. She said she could look it up and provide that information. She said all the keys to her sliding glass doors were accounted for. She said during the incident she heard the suspect go out the downstairs sliding glass door a couple of times.

V1 said after the incident she remembered seeing the chain on the front door, and the down stairs sliding glass door was closed but it was unlocked.

I asked V1 if there was a maintenance guy for the building and she said she didn't know.

She said she attempted to obtain her cell phone information that Det. Solomon requested from AT&T but they told her they needed a subpoena from the Police, to provide that information. She said the IT guy from her work would attempt to itemize her cell phone information when the company bill came in the next few weeks.

Lt. Sato provided V1 with MVPD consent to search forms for her cell phone, computer and her home, which she signed. He explained that MVPD would be searching for physical evidence in this case. I provide V1 with the contact information for Victim's assistance.

I asked V1 if she had checked her financial accounts after the incident and she said she changed all the accounts and there was no unusual activity.

V1 said when the suspect was asking her the identity theft questions, he asked her about her name, DOB, Social Security number, mother's maiden name, and how long she had lived at the residence. He asked her about prior addresses she lived at. She said she lived at St. in Mountain View. She said it was an old house that the owner had converted into four separate apartments. She said the suspect also asked when her parents passed away.

I advised V1 that the detectives would need to obtain DNA swabs from her and Christian for elimination purposes.

Lt. Sato and I concluded the interview and advised V1 that MVPD detective would be contacting her for further follow up.

Details:

On 10/15/09 at approximately 1830 hours, Lieutenant Sato, Officer Smith and I responded to 1920 Silverwood Avenue in Mountain View to assist in the follow-up investigation of the initial reported False Imprisonment case. Lieutenant Sato obtained keys to the listed residence from the victim, Doe #1, Jane prior to our arrival at the residence.

Doe #1 granted MVPD access to the apartment to search for additional evidence. We used the aid of a black light device and alternate laser lighting source device upon the computer room/office, bedroom, bathroom, and downstairs area of the residence in search for possible seminal fluids of the suspect. During our search, we located an unidentified substance upon the computer keyboard located in I Doe #1 s computer room/office. I subsequently took a sample of the substance in addition to a control sample. Both were later booked into MVPD Evidence under #FET 1 and #FET 2.

Officer Smith took digital photographs of the computer room/office desk area and keyboard prior to me collecting the samples. He also took a couple digital photographs of a crumpled up piece of tissue located along the northwall of the office. This appeared unusual due to the fact that the garbage can was located on the other side of the room, nowhere near the discarded tissue. We used the alternate laser lighting source device on the tissue, but did not see any substances upon it. It was not collected as evidence. We located nothing else of evidentary value during our search of the residence.
