Carmichael Food Closet

The Carmichael Food Closet, located at Carmichael Presbyterian Church, has been dedicated to serving our community since 1973. Families can contact us at (916) 483-9232 between 10 a.m. and noon on Mondays, Tuesdays, or Thursdays. Food bags are prepared from 12:00 to 1:30 p.m., and families can drive through to pick up their requested food from that morning between 1:30 and 2:00 p.m. on those days. Additionally, we offer an evening pickup on Thursdays from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. Each food bag is designed to feed a family for at least three days.

Our operation is supported by 180 volunteers who assist in collecting, organizing, and distributing the food. Volunteers and food donations come from Carmichael Presbyterian Church, local grocery stores, as well as other churches and service groups in the greater Carmichael community.

North Highlands Christian Food Ministry

The North Highlands Christian Food Ministry started in the 1970s as a closet in a church to assist service members stationed at the local military base. Since then, we have grown to serve those in need in the local communities, mainly in the North Highlands, Antelope and Foothill Farms areas.

We are funded by several local churches and by good hearted community members. We welcome donations of non-perishable foods and cash donations as well.

We recently relocated to a new distribution site in Antelope, near the intersection of Watt Ave. and Elverta Rd. Since the move, we have experienced continual growth in families needing assistance. We are fast approaching serving 800 families totaling nearly 3,000 individuals each month.

We take great pride in operating as an all-volunteer food pantry and invite anyone who wants to serve to be a member of our family.

We distribute every Tuesday from 9 am to noon at 8155 Watt Ave, Antelope, CA 95843.
