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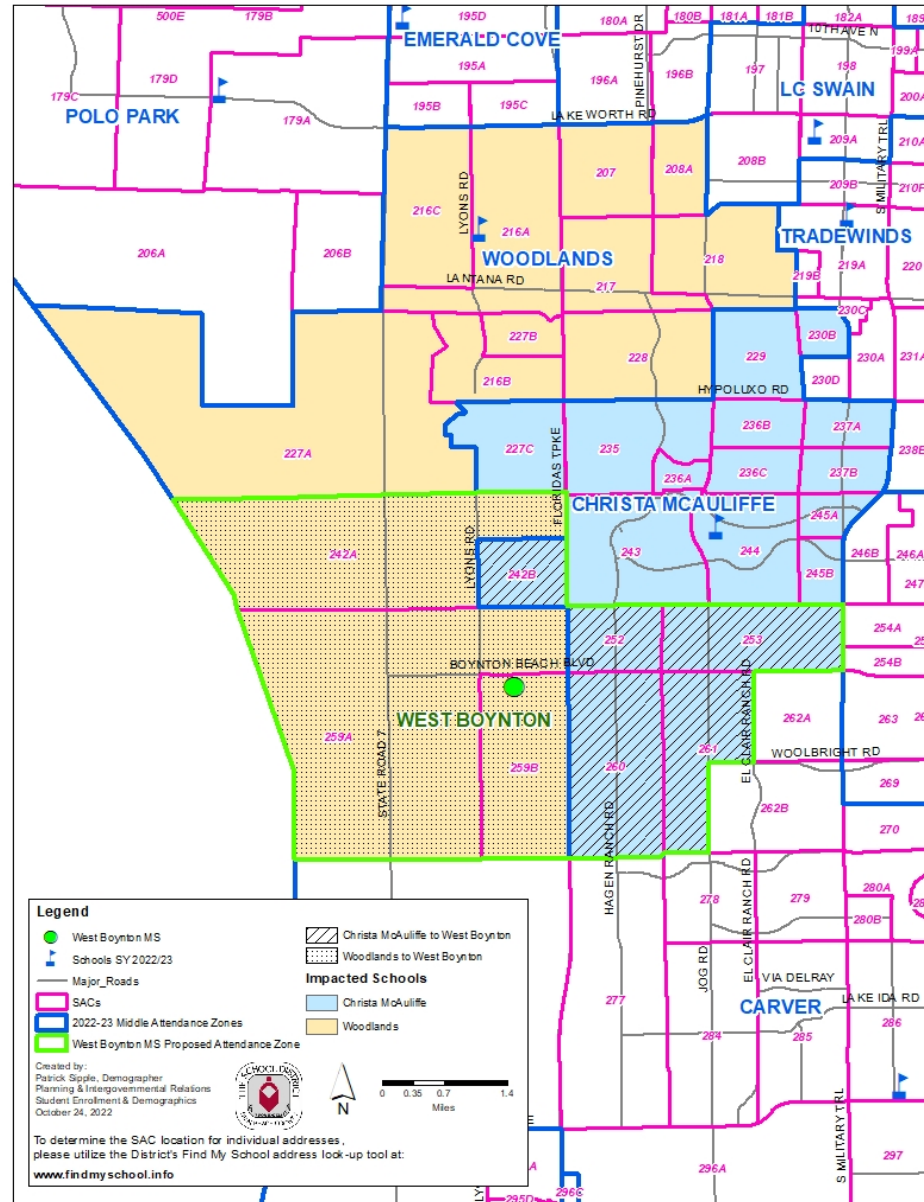

Study West Boynton Middle WB-1 - Establishes the attendance zone for West Boynton Middle School and shifts the student attendance boundaries for two (2) Middle Schools – Christa McAuliffe and Woodlands

Dr. Joaquin Garcia High Boundary Study 3/7 Hybrid - Superintendent's Recommendation - Establishes the attendance zone for Dr. Joaquin Garcia High School and shifts the student attendance boundaries for eight (8) High Schools – Boynton Beach, Forest Hill, John I. Leonard, Olympic Heights, Palm Beach Central, Park Vista, Santaluces, and Wellington

Study West Boynton Middle WB-1 Proposed Boundary Attendance Zone Changes



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Study West Boynton Middle WB-1 Projected Data

Projections assume current 7th graders entering 8th grade in SY2023-24, and their current 6th grade siblings, will have the option to remain. Projections also assume the rising SY2023-24 6th grade siblings (current 5th graders) of current 7th grade students, will have the option to stay for the remainder of their middle school years.

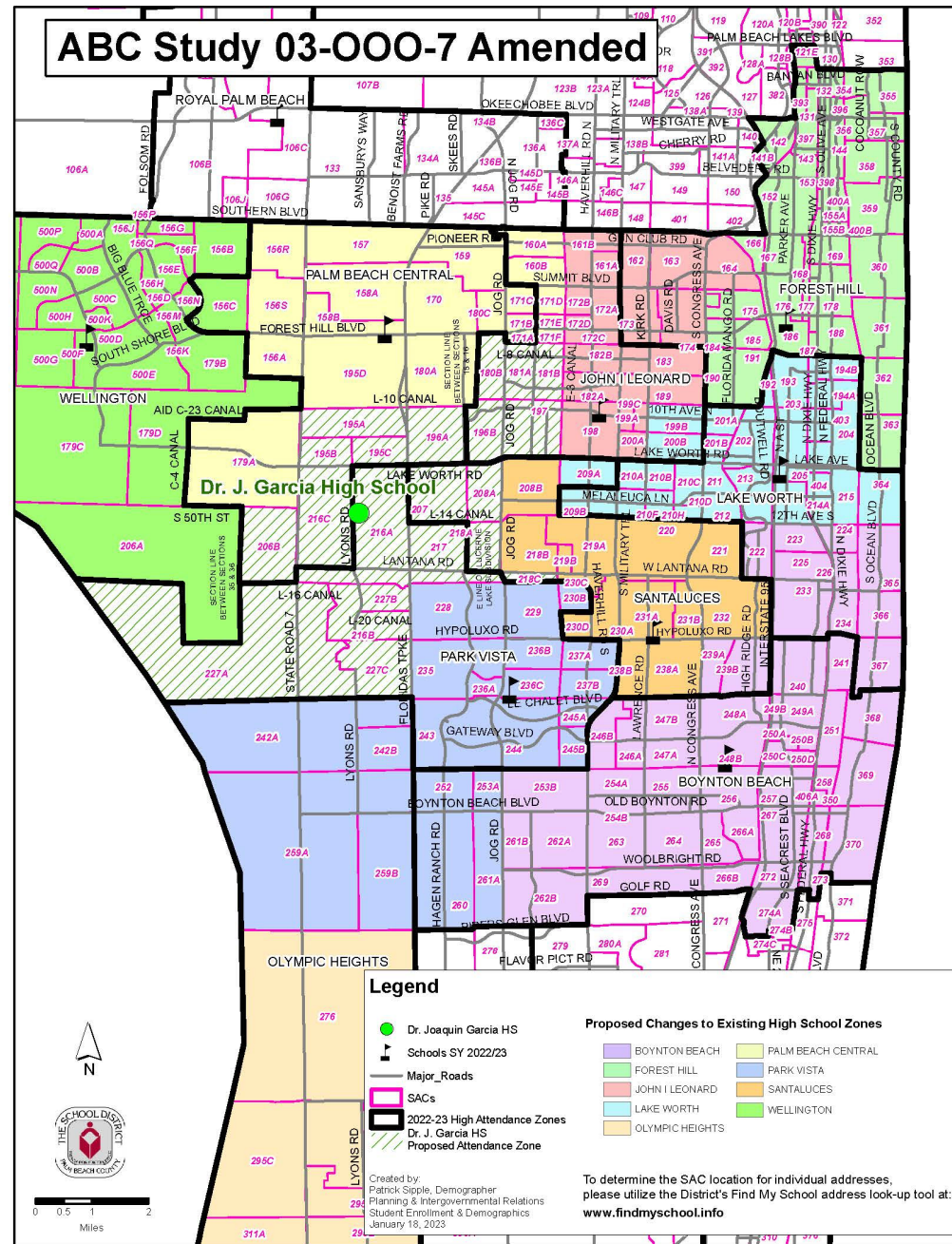

Study West Boynton Middle WB-1

Overview

- Provides immediate and projected future enrollment relief for Christa McAuliffe and Woodlands while providing enrollment for new West Boynton Middle.
- The study balances utilization at the three schools.
- This study creates a compact attendance zone for West Boynton Middle and creates more compact zones for Christa McAuliffe and Woodlands by reducing the size of the schools' current attendance zones.
- Advisory Boundary Committee (ABC) meetings with community input were held on December 8th and 20th.
- On December 20, 2022, the ABC voted 15-0 to recommend "Study WB-1" to the Superintendent.
- The study specified that current 7th grade students and their current 6th grade siblings would be permitted to opt-in to remain at their current SY2022-23 schools. The study also specified that the incoming SY2023-24 6th grade siblings of current 7th grade students would also have the option to remain for the remainder of their middle school years.
- Per School Board Policy 5.01, current 7th graders who opt to remain are not automatically entitled to District transportation; for other students in the change areas who are provided the option to remain, transportation is not provided. Based on past history, transportation is not typically provided for any students who opt to remain.

ABC Recommendation – Dr. Joaquin Garcia High - Study 7 Amended



Summary of ABC Recommendations

- Advisory Boundary Committee (ABC) meetings with community input were held on December 8th and 20th, and January 12th and 26th.
- On January 12, 2023, the ABC voted 8-6 to recommend “ABC Study 03000-7 Amended” to the Superintendent.
- Some of the concerns expressed by the six dissenting votes included the following: SAC 179A remaining zoned to Palm Beach Central although Dr. Joaquin Garcia High is in closer proximity, proximity concerns for students proposed to move from Lake Worth to Boynton Beach High, proximity concerns for students residing in John I. Leonard SACs proposed to move to Dr. Joaquin Garcia High, concerns that the City of Greenacres would be split amongst five high schools, and traffic safety concerns within SAC 227C.
- On January 26, 2023, the ABC voted 12-4 to recommend additional suggestions for consideration by the Superintendent alongside Study 7-Amended. The additional ABC suggestions for the Superintendent’s consideration are as follows:

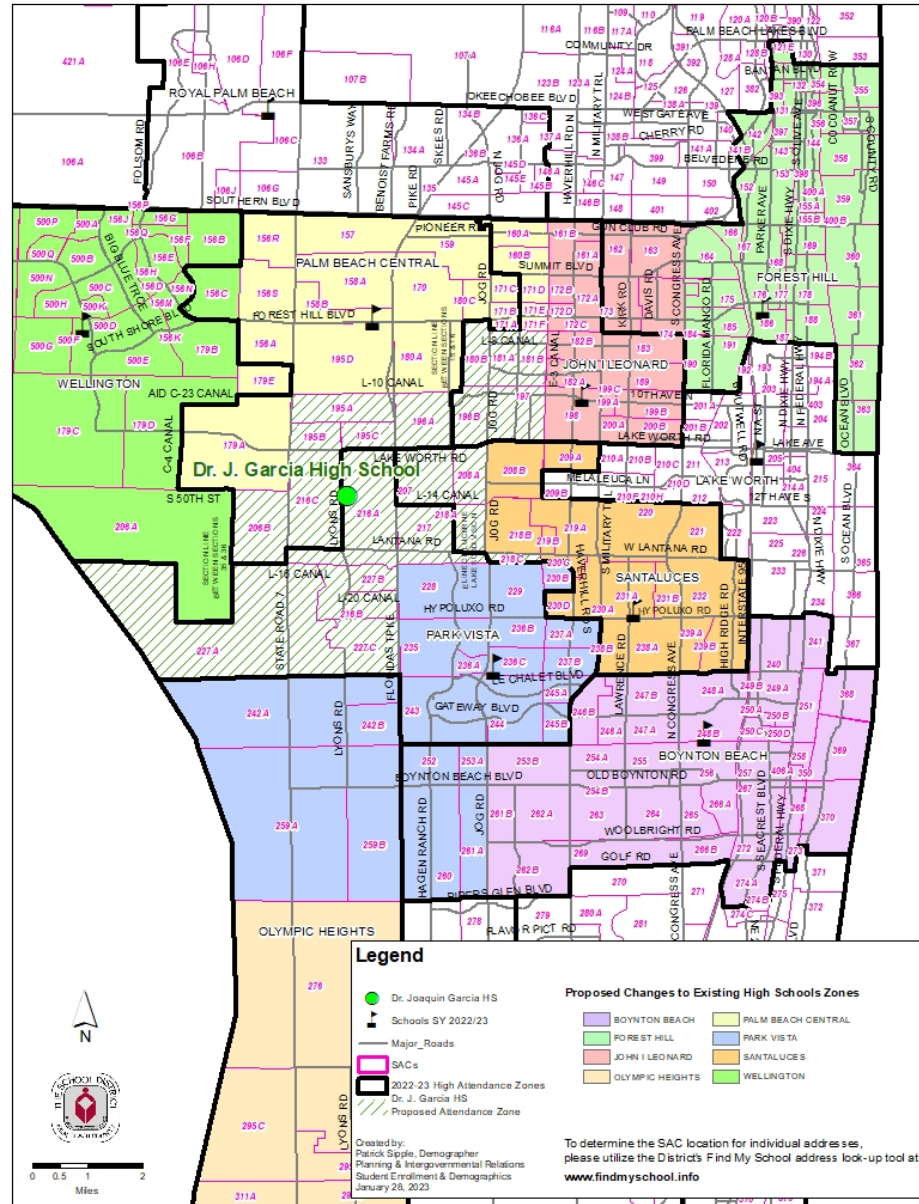
Concerns of the Committee

- Allow for rising juniors to remain in their current schools, in addition to the rising seniors and their siblings
- Provide for additional resources at Boynton Beach Community High School
- Ensure sufficient resources for Dr. Joaquin Garcia High School
- Attempt to achieve optimal utilization and/or accommodate space requirements for current and/or future programmatic needs.
- Continue to enforce Policy 5.011, to include Park Vista High.

Community concerns heard by the Committee

- Consider SAC 227C traffic safety concerns.
- The feeder pattern for SAC 227C isolated them from their Christa McAuliffe Middle peers to Park Vista High School.
- Study 7 does not address the concerns of Greenacres officials and parents and has Greenacres students going to five different high schools.
- Students that have auditioned for, or in a merit-based program, should be given the opportunity to remain at their current high schools to complete their programs.

Dr. Joaquin Garcia High Boundary Study 3/7 Hybrid - Superintendent's Recommendation Overview

- Provides immediate and future enrollment relief for Forest Hill, John I. Leonard, Olympic Heights, Palm Beach Central, Park Vista, and Santaluces while providing enrollment for new Dr. Joaquin Garcia HS, though a number of high schools would remain slightly over 100% utilization.
- The study balances utilization at seven of the nine total high schools.
- The study on average reduces overall drive distance for students.
- Current 11th grade students and their current 9th grade siblings will be permitted to opt-in to remain at their current SY2022-23 schools. Incoming SY2023-24 9th grade siblings of current 11th grade students will also have the option to remain for the remainder of their high school years.
- The recommendation also provides current 10th grade students the option to remain at their current SY2022-23 schools, with their current 9th grade siblings and incoming SY2023-24 9th grade siblings having the option to remain for the remainder of their high school years.
- Per School Board Policy 5.01, current 11th graders who opt to remain are not automatically entitled to District transportation; for other students in the change areas who are provided the option to remain, transportation is not provided. Based on past history, transportation is not typically provided for any students who opt to remain.

Discussion

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
