# CANVASSING OVERVIEW

All canvassing will start at 10 am till completed.

## POST-ELECTION CANVASS DATES:

- July 21 - **Vote By Mail (VBM) 1**
- July 27 - **Provisional and VBM** (5 of each Ballot Styles)
- July 29 - **VBM 2**

# OFFICIAL BALLOT DROP BOXES PROCEDURES

Consisting of 4 teams of 2 bipartisan employees and 1 bipartisan week-end team.

- Each location is assigned to a route and each team has a designated route
- Record total on the Dropbox Integrity/Transportation Log
- Secure the contents from the drop box in the locked **YELLOW** bag

Bring back to Anne Arundel County Board of Elections (AACBOE) for:

- Verification of the Dropbox Integrity/Transportation Log
- By recounting for each location to match what was picked up.
  - If there is a discrepancy, resolve the issue by:
    - Recounting, check for adding errors, etc....



# OFFICIAL BALLOT DROP BOXES PICK UP SCHEDULE



- The drop box pick-ups will occur 2x a day with the exception of Election Day. On Election Day there will be a 3rd pick-up when the polls close at 8pm.
- The correctional facilities drop boxes will be picked up 1x a week, then starting July 11, 2022 it will increase to 2x a week until Election Day. After the July 19th election the facilities will be picked up once a month.

## ONCE BALLOTS ARE RECEIVED

The High Speed Mail Sorting machine will:

1. Timestamp
2. Sort into batches of 50
  - a. By ballot style, underweight, overweight, no signature, precincts, absentee type and unreadable barcodes
3. Imaging captures all documents on both sides
4. Checks documents into MDVOTERS as received according to how we received the ballot:
  - a. Mail, Drop Box, Drop off in Office, In Person, Agent, Nursing Home

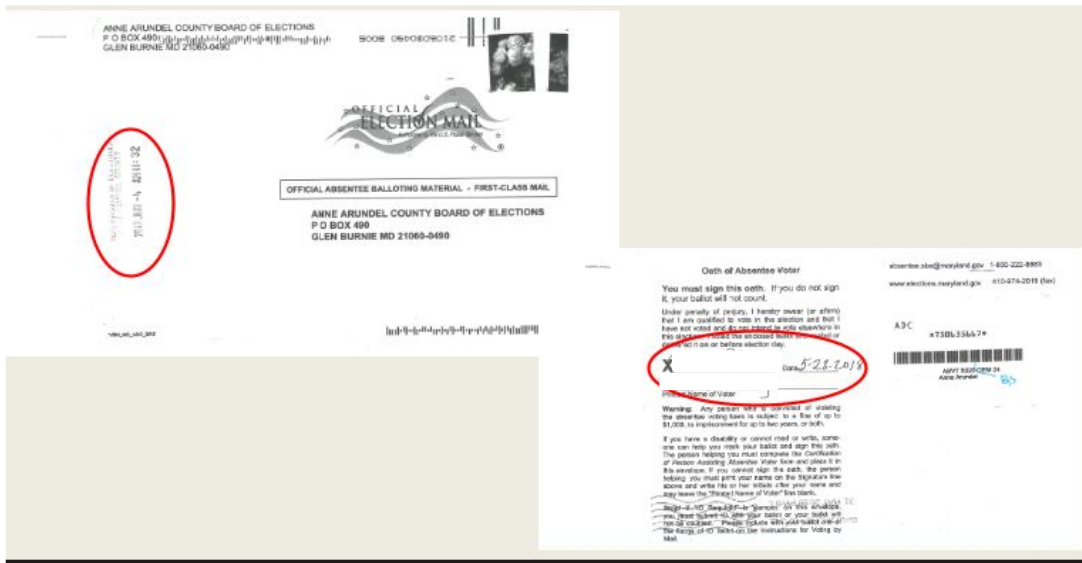
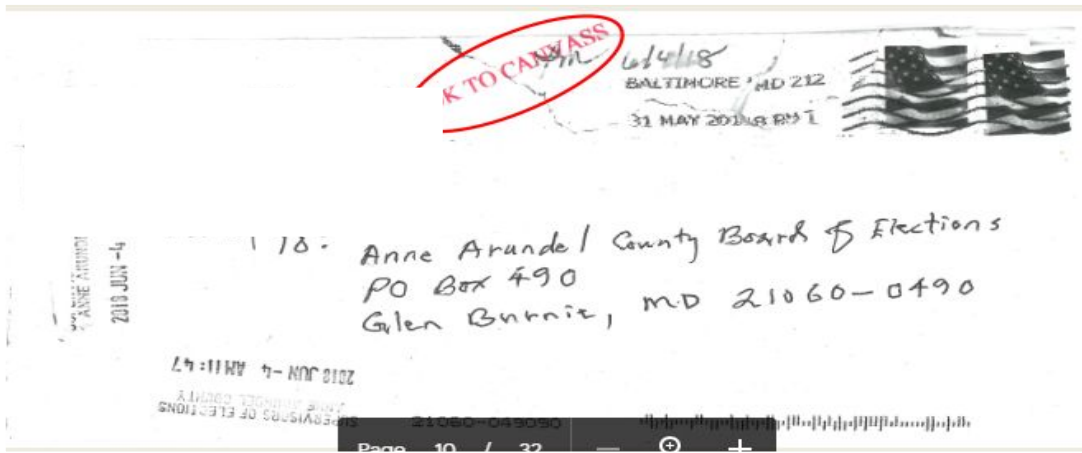
## VERIFYING THE BATCH

# AS A BIPARTISAN TEAM START WITH CANVASSING OF THE BALLOT ENVELOPES



As a bipartisan team, inspect the envelope for:

- ❑ **Dates** - Postmarked by Election Day July 19, 2022 and received by 10 am the second Friday after the Election (July 29, 2022)
- ❑ **Signature** - If it is missing on the oath or the wrong name then it is referred to board on last canvassing day (July 29, 2022). During this time in-between we will try get the voter to sign the oath.

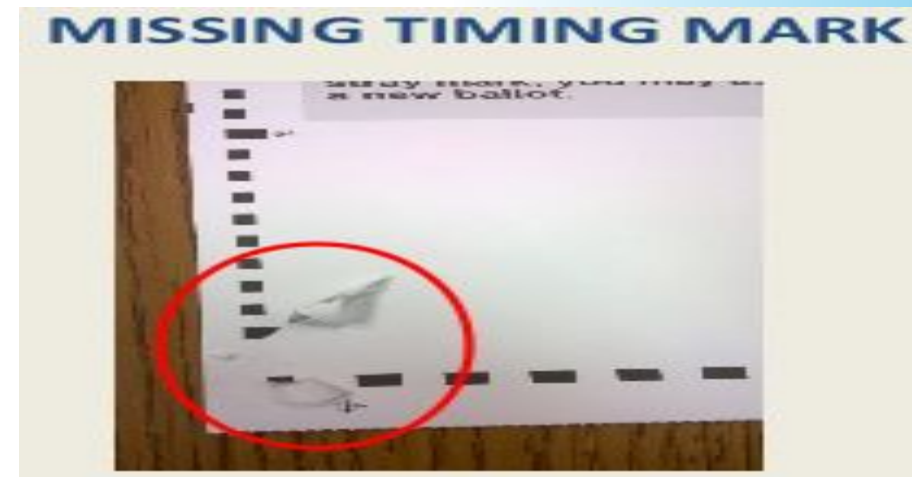
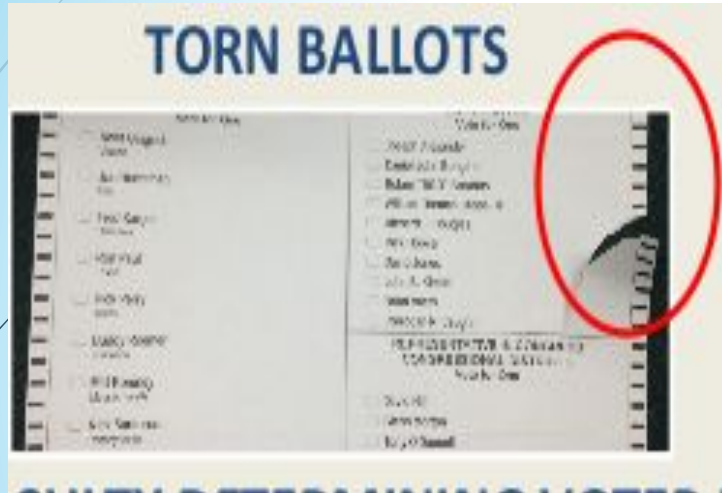
**Ballot Issues that need automatic duplication:**

- ☐ Tears
- ☐ Timing Mark Issues
- ☐ Ink Bleed Through – It is okay to run if not interfering with another cast vote. (If voter intent is not clear, refer it to the Board)
- ☐ Food Stains - Automatically duplicate if you can determine voters intent

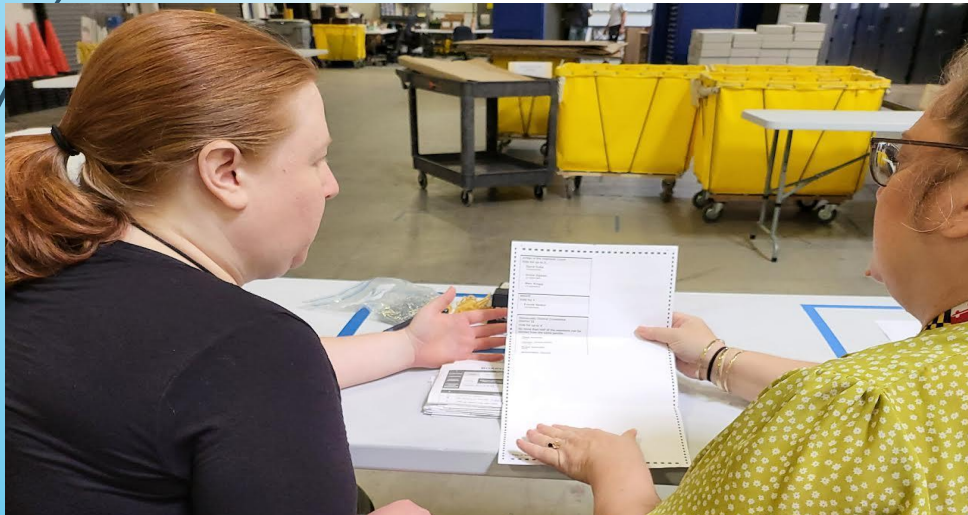
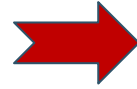

## HOW THE BALLOT IS HANDLED IF THE BOARD REFERRAL WAS ACCEPTED

- The Cantrack status will be updated to accepted in the issue batch
  - Then given to the canvassers if it needs to be duplicated or
  - If it is okay to process, it will be kept in the batch to be scanned through the DS850 High Speed Scanner to be counted.

## HOW THE BALLOT IS HANDLED IF THE BOARD REFERRAL WAS REJECTED

- The Cantrack status will remain as rejected
- MDVOTERS will be kept as rejected and is updated to reflect the reason the board unanimously agreed to a rejection.
  - This ballot will NOT be ran through the DS850 High Speed Scanner to be counted. However the voter will be given voting credit.

# DUPLICATION PROCESS AND PROCEDURE

- **Bipartisan duplication canvassing teams copy onto a blank card stock ballot from the voters completed ballot.**
  - **One team member reads the voter selection while the other team member fills in the ovals selected by the voter (Common reasons why a ballot cannot be tabulated are a ballot on which the voter has erased his or her original selection and made another selection or the voter made a stray mark on the ballot).**
  - **They then switch roles. This is to make sure the integrity of the election is upheld during the duplication process. If a vote was duplicated incorrectly the ballot has to be stamped “SPOILED” and recorded on the Duplication Log as such. The duplication process is started over in this case.**
  - **When the process is completed the original ballot is stamped VOID (in red) on both sides and the duplicated ballot is stamped as DUPLICATED (In black) on both sides.**
  - **This process is also recorded on a Duplication Log.**
  - **Once the batch or a ballot (that was referred to the board and is being accepted) has been duplicated the batch is ready to be scanned. (Ballots on plain paper need to be duplicated onto the card stock ballots so they can be tabulated and counted through the DS850 High Speed Scanner).**

- ✓ When the process is completed the original ballot is stamped VOID (in red) on both sides and the duplicated ballot is stamped as DUPLICATED (In black) on both sides. If an mistake was made this ballot must be Spoiled.

# RULES OF CONDUCT FOR CANVASS OBSERVERS

## State of Maryland



### Rules of Conduct for Canvass Observers

Members of the public and media are encouraged to observe the local board of canvassers canvass absentee and provisional ballots. During the canvasses, it is the responsibility of the local board of canvassers to maintain order and safeguard all records and documents. Please be mindful of the following rules of conduct for individuals observing a canvass.

- ❖ Print your name on the canvass sign-in sheet
- ❖ Direct all questions to the Election Director or his or her designee
- ❖ You may observe the canvass teams reviewing the ballots but must maintain a reasonable distance
- ❖ Do **not** touch the ballots or other election documents
- ❖ Do **not** make excessive noises or cause distractions
- ❖ No food or drink are allowed in the canvassing room
- ❖ Do **not** use cell phones or other audible devices in the canvassing room
- ❖ If you have information that you believe should be considered by the Board of Canvassers, immediately notify the Election Director or his or her designee

# CANVASS CHALLENGE FORM

**State of Maryland**  
**Canvass Challenge Form**

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**Instructions:** State regulations permit an individual to challenge an action of a local board of canvassers. If you wish to challenge a decision to accept or reject an absentee or provisional ballot, notify the election director or his or her designee, complete this form, and return it to the election director or his or her designee. You may only challenge a decision during the canvass at which the ballot was accepted or rejected.

Once you submit this completed form, the ballot(s) being challenged and related documents (oath and envelope if an absentee ballot or provisional ballot application if a provisional ballot) will be put aside for consideration by the local board of canvassers. The local board will review the information on this form to decide whether to change its decision to accept or reject the ballot(s) in question. All challenged ballots will be separated from other ballots. If the local board affirms its acceptance of the ballot(s), the ballot(s) will be counted on a separate memory card.



- I am not the voter's employer or an agent of the voter's employer.
- I am not an officer or agent of the voter's union.
- I helped this voter to mark their ballot.
- **I did not try to influence the voter** to vote for or against any candidate or question appearing on the ballot.

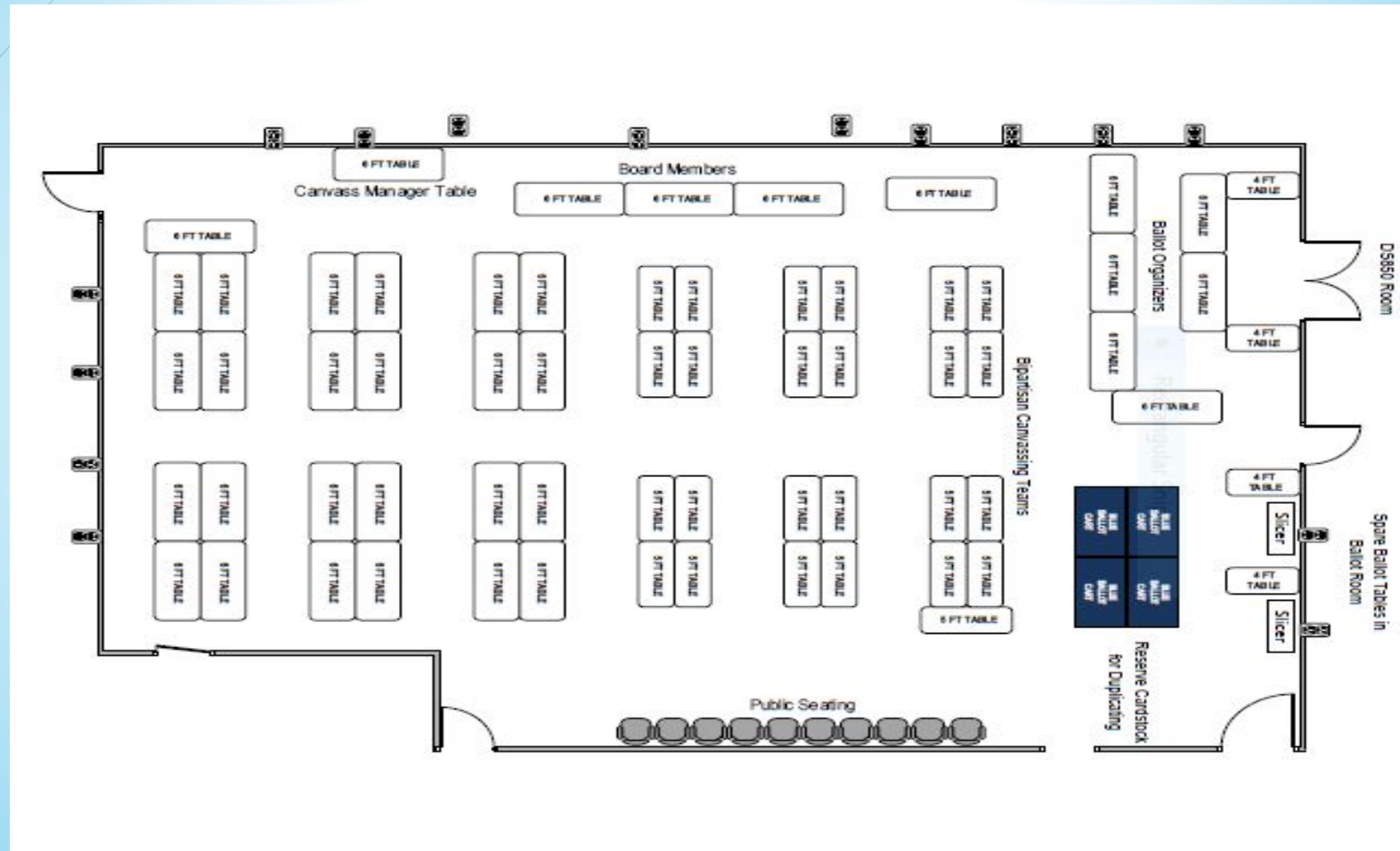
## **New for 2022**

- **Designated area mapped out on the tables for the placement of the ballots, envelopes, identifying paperwork and any other documentation returned with the ballot.**

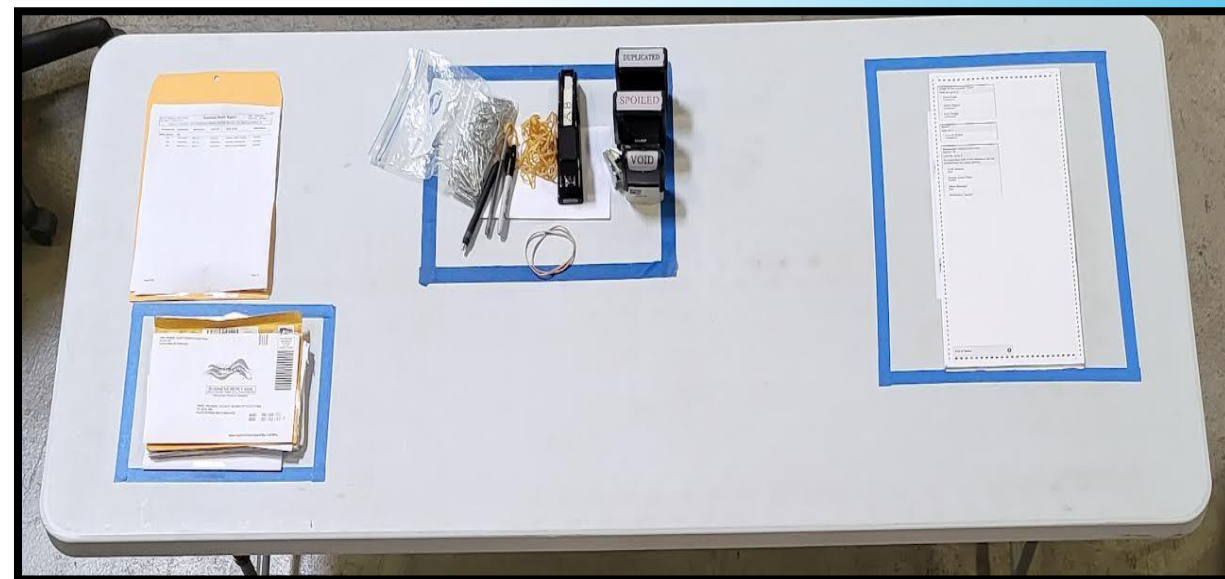
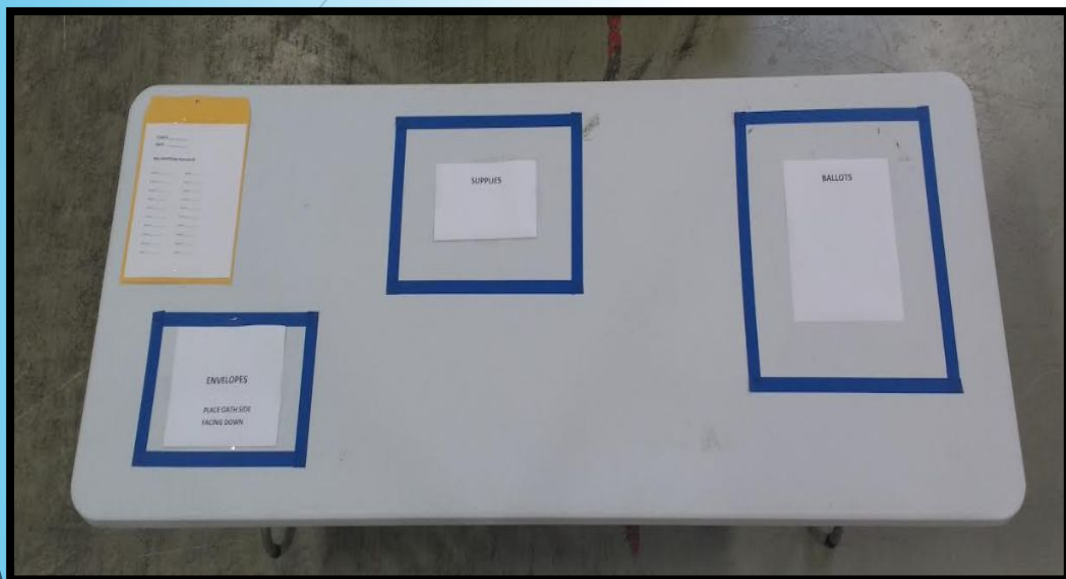

## BALLOTS CARE, CUSTODY, AND CONTROL

- Voted ballots are kept in a black secure locked ballot cart for safekeeping until they are canvassed.
  - Once the batch is ready to be counted and tabulated they are sent to the DS850 high speed scanner.
  - After they are scanned they are kept in a secure Ballot Storage Room until after canvassing is completed.
  - They are then boxed up and sent to Iron Mountain for archive storage for 22 months.

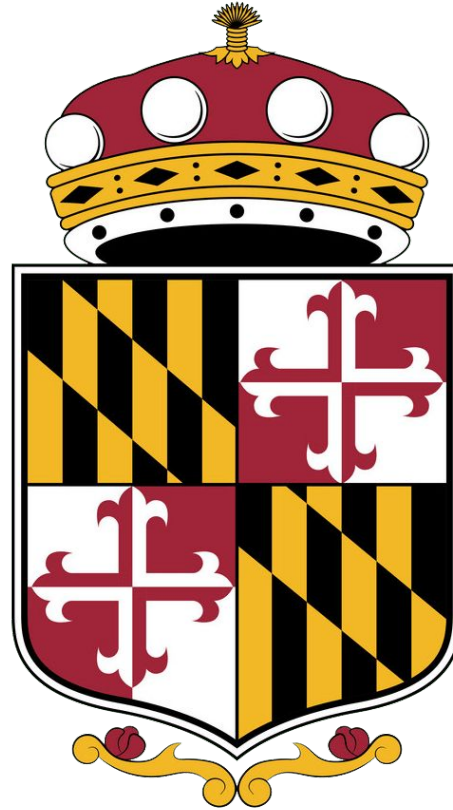




## **CERTIFYING THE ELECTION**
