If the applicant provides a REAL ID Act of 2005 driver's license or ID card as Proof of Identity and Age from LIST B, the applicant must also present <i>one</i> (1) of the following documents issued by the U.S. Federal Government verified through SAVE:		
	1. Unexpired immigrant or nonimmigrant visa status for admission into the United States	
	2. Pending or approved application for asylum in the United States	
	3. Admission into the United States as a refugee	
	<b>4.</b> Pending or approved application for temporary protected status in the United States	
	5. Approved deferred action status	
	<b>6.</b> Pending application for adjustment of status to legal permanent resident or conditional resident	
	7. Conditional permanent resident alien status	
	<b>8.</b> Other documents as DHS may designate by notice published in the Federal Register
