

**Residence commonly known as 5201 N. 99 St. Kansas City, Wyandotte County, Kansas**

I, Brittanie Pruitt, a Detective with the Kansas City Kansas Police Department, being of lawful age, having first duly sworn upon my oath, do hereby depose and state:

That on Wednesday, November 25, 2016 at about 1143 hours, officers responded on an armed disturbance (domestic) at 5201 N. 99 St. Kansas City, Wyandotte County, KS. Upon arrival, they contacted the victim (Heather Jones, w/f, 02/04/86). Ms. Jones stated that she had been involved in a domestic argument with her husband (Michael A. Jones, b/m, 01/11/71). During the argument, he strangled her and struck her with a handgun. He also fired two shots at her as she ran from the house. Ms. Jones had numerous red marks on her neck that were consistent with being strangled. She also had cuts on her forehead and face and a swollen and bruised mark under her right eye. Officers located Michael Jones at the intersection of 99th and Hutton Road, while he was returning to the home (shortly after the initial domestic call to 911) and arrested him. Det. Littlefield interviewed Michael Jones at the Det. Bureau immediately after his arrest. Prior to the interview, Det. Littlefield read him the Miranda warning. Michael Jones admitted to strangling Heather and to firing shots outside the residence (although he denied shooting at Heather). During the interview, Det. Littlefield received information that Heather and Michael had a seven-year-old son named A.J. (DOB: x-x-2008) and that sometime on (or about) September 28, 2015, A.J. had died and Michael disposed of his body by feeding it to pigs. Det. Littlefield confronted Michael with this information and he corroborated the story. He also stated that he had retrieved the remains of A.J. and placed them into a tub with a pick lid and that the remains were in the barn where the pigs were kept.

A search warrant was executed at 5201 N. 99 St. on Thursday, November 26, 2015.  
The following is a partial list of evidence recovered:

- 1 – Spent .40 cal. shell casing (located behind the house, next to a wooden privacy fence)
- 1 – Plastic tub with a pink lid containing a human skull (with what appeared to be flesh and hair still attached) along with numerous other bones
- Numerous pieces of tile with brownish-red stains (from a shower stall where A.J. was allegedly imprisoned)
- 5 – Pigs (located in a stall in a barn behind the house)

Detectives Littlefield and B. Lancaster #1912 interviewed Heather Jones on Saturday, November 28, 2015. During the interview she provided additional information about her and Michael abusing A.J. while he was living with them. She specifically stated that A.J. had been strapped to an “inversion table” for extended periods of time. She stated that the inversion table was outside of the residence, but was not recovered because its significance was not known at the time.


On December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2015 a Search Warrant was executed based on the above information to search for and seize the inversion table and additional human remains. While searching for those items, additional items believed to be relevant to the investigation were located by law enforcement. A rake and shovel were located in the pig pen. Michael Jones made statements to Det. Littlefield during the initial interviews that he collected A.J.’s bones and put them in a bucket at some point after the pigs ate the remains of A.J. Because of the location of the rake and shovel, it appears they could have been used to gather the bones.

Additionally, tikki torches were located by the pool area behind the home. Video evidence recovered during the original search, shows A.J. being made to hold tikki torches in a pose like stance outside of the home. The tikki torches appear to be the same as depicted in the video. Additionally, another spent shell casing was located in the yard behind the house. Based on this additional information, an addendum search warrant was obtained and executed December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2015 for the following items: Tikki torches, Rake and shovel, Spent shell casing.

While on scene searching for and collecting those items, Heather Jones arrived and asked to retrieve important business documents for a business partner who was leaving town this same day. Officers were not holding the residential structure for their search at that time. Based on officer safety concerns, Detective Lancaster offered to escort Heather into the home or offered to let her wait until the execution of the search warrant was completed. Heather asked that Detective Lancaster walk her through the home. Detective Lancaster emphasized he was not attempting to search the home. While inside, Detective Lancaster received a request to ask Heather if there were any items belonging to A.J. or that may contain a sample of this DNA. Heather went into the master bedroom closet and located a coat, cloth item with straps that she described as a pillow, pair of underwear and a mouthpiece. When she moved a dresser covering a window, Heather discovered a board secured to the window frame with several cloth wrappings around it. Heather spontaneously uttered that is one place where A.J. was tied up. Heather also showed detective Lancaster a small gauze wrap which she says contains a tooth she believes belonged to A.J. that she kept after Michael knocked it out. She also discovered a length of gauze wrapping which may have been used to tie up and restrain A.J. These items are relevant to the investigation.

Based on this additional information, I am requesting to search and seize the following items:

- Gauze wrap with tooth
- Used gauze wrapping
- Coats or clothing believed to be worn by A.J.
- Mouthpiece
- Underwear believed to be worn by A.J.
- "Pillow"
- Board and cloth wrapping
