

We are Proposing Rate Adjustments to Meet Future Needs

The last rate increase for RSW services was approved in 2015 with adjustments phased in over three years. If rates remain as they are today, our funds will be depleted by FY 2022/23. By law, a utility must charge what it costs to provide services. The proposed rate increases help address:

- More processing restrictions and shrinking markets for recyclables means increased costs for RSW to recycle vs. recyclables being a revenue stream
- New costs associated with securing long-term yard waste and organics disposal for food waste, starting in 2021
- Increasing costs for solid waste operations (such as, vehicles, maintenance, fuel and disposal fees)
- Labor cost increases
- Landfill-related expenses continue to rise

To fund necessary services RSW proposes a three-year rate adjustment. If approved, the rates will become effective on January 1, 2020.

The proposed rates will be presented at upcoming Utility Rate Advisory Commission meetings on June 26 and August 28, 2019. You are invited to attend and provide comments. Please visit **cityofsacramento.org** for more details.

The formal rate hearing will likely occur in August. Customers will receive a notification by mail 45 days before the hearing.

Following the commission meetings and rate hearing, the final rate proposal will be presented to the Sacramento City Council in fall 2019.





NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING RESIDENTIAL GARBAGE, YARD WASTE, RECYCLING COLLECTION AND STREET SWEEPING SERVICES

This notice contains information about a proposed rate increase for residential garbage, yard waste, recycling collection and street sweeping services. The City of Sacramento will hold a Public Hearing before the Utilities Rate Advisory Commission on Wednesday, August 28, 2019 at 5:30 p.m., City Hall Council Chamber - 915 "!" Street, Sacramento, CA. 95814, to consider adopting increases to the City's waste collection and recycling services.

The Recycling and Solid Waste (RSW) division implements a diligent financial planning process to ensure it can meet new regulatory requirements and cover increased costs. This effort ensures funds are available to maintain, repair, improve and streamline RSW's operations. Detailed financial information about the division is available at sacrecycle.org. The last rate increases for RSW services were approved in 2015. A provider of property-related utility services must charge what it costs to provide the services.

The proposed rate increases will help address:

- An increase in street sweeping services from every six weeks to once a month during the months of February - October
- New recycling processing costs. Recycling no longer generates revenue due to changes in the recycle market. The city is still required to divert recyclable materials from the landfill.
- Rising labor costs
- New costs associated with securing long-term yard waste and organics disposal for food waste starting in 2021
- Increasing costs for operations such as vehicles, maintenance, fuel and disposal fees
- Increased landfill related expenses to meet regulatory requirements for closure maintenance

State law allows property owners to protest proposed rate increases for waste collection, recycling, and street sweeping services. Proposed rate increases may not be implemented if a majority of the affected property owners protests the rate increases. Instructions on filing a protest are at the end of this notice.

Food Waste Only Rate	Collection of residential food waste has been mandated by the State of California to begin by January 1, 2022. The city intends to implement food waste collection in 2021. When implementation of this collection program starts, the city plans to have customers dispose of food waste in their yard waste container. The proposed yard waste rates include the addition of food waste. However, there are some customers who do not receive yard waste service. These customers will still need to dispose of food waste separately from garbage and it will be collected weekly. Written Protest Procedures

State law allows the owner of record or the tenant of a parcel subject to the proposed rate changes, to submit a written protest to the City Clerk at or before the time set for the public hearing. Only one protest per parcel is allowed. A written protest must include the assessor's parcel number and address of the affected parcel. Emailed protests will not be accepted.
