A SURVEY OF LIKELY NEW HAMPSHIRE REPUBLICAN PRESIDENTIAL PRIMARY VOTERS

September 19-20, 2023

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Survey Notes

These results are from a Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 931 New Hampshire Republican Presidential Primary likely voters. Surveys were collected between September 19th and 20th, 2023, from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. Candidates were presented in random order for the favorability and ballot preference questions. The survey has an overall margin of sampling error of +/- 3.2% with a confidence interval of 95%. The data are weighted for age, gender, geography, and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.

Summary

New Hampshire Institute of Politics Executive Director Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, "Former President Donald Trump is maintaining his grip on the New Hampshire Republican Presidential Primary, and now leads his closest challengers by a 3-1 margin. The continued deterioration of Florida Governor Ron DeSantis' support has created space for former United Nations Ambassador Nikki Haley and former New Jersey Governor Chris Christie to grow. As in 2016, however, opposition to Trump is diluted over several candidates, preventing the consolidation that would be necessary to deny him a third straight nomination."

Former President Donald Trump maintains a significant lead. 45% of respondents express their preference for Trump on the ballot test, a 30-point lead over his closest challenger, former United Nations Ambassador Nikki Haley.

Florida Governor Ron DeSantis' support has plunged 18 points since March, and he has fallen back to the pack. DeSantis now trails Haley with 11%, and is only slightly ahead of former New Jersey Governor Chris Christie (10%).

DeSantis may have maneuvered himself into a political dead-end by attempting to brand himself as an alternative to Trump. 11% of respondents with a favorable opinion of Trump select DeSantis on the ballot test, along with 12% that have an unfavorable opinion of Trump. He doesn't appeal to either group strongly enough to have maintained his early status as Trump's strongest challenger.

Former New Jersey Governor Chris Christie continues to grow his support, but may have hit his ceiling. Christie has succeeded in branding himself as the harshest critic of Trump, but at a cost. Although he has picked up the support of 29% of respondents who have an unfavorable impression of Trump, he has virtually no support from respondents who view Trump favorably. Christie thus suffers from a negative 46-point net favorability (25%-71%) as the primary electorate has polarized against him.

Haley has had some success threading the needle with Trump supporters as she moves into a distant second behind Trump. Haley leads Christie 32%-29% on the ballot test among respondents that have an unfavorable impression of Trump, but trails only DeSantis (11%) and Trump himself (68%) among those with a favorable impression with 7%. She carries a 37-point net positive favorability (65%-28%), suggesting that she still has room to grow her support.

A fractured field means the eventual Republican nominee will have to work to consolidate their support against President Joe Biden if he stands for re-election. Only 46% of the Republican primary voters tested say that they would vote for Christie in a general election match-up with Biden. 73% would vote for DeSantis, 74% would vote for Trump or Haley, and 76% would vote for Scott. This reflects a deep polarization in the primary electorate between supporters and detractors of Trump.







About SACSC

The Saint Anselm College Survey Center (SACSC) was founded in the wake of the 2016 election, and launched its first poll in February 2018 as the midterm elections were getting underway. Housed within the New Hampshire Institute of Politics at Saint Anselm College, the Center conducts quarterly polls of New Hampshire voter attitudes and additional polls as circumstances warrant. This research supports the academic mission of the College, and provides students with a practical education in survey techniques while providing the public at large with insight into political opinion trends that impact the state's federal and gubernatorial elections. To support its operations, the Center performs commissioned research on behalf of nonprofit organizations and corporations.
