**A SURVEY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE
VOTER ATTITUDES
APRIL 2020**

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SURVEY NOTES:

These results are from the Saint Anselm College Survey Center poll based on online surveys of 820 New Hampshire registered voters expressing an interest in this fall's elections for President, Governor, and Congress. Surveys were collected from cell phone users randomly drawn from a sample of registered voters reflecting the demographic and partisan characteristics of the voting population. The survey has a margin of sampling error of +/- 3.4% with a confidence interval of 95%; the margin of sampling error for questions specific to the 1st and 2nd Congressional Districts is +/- 4.7% and +/- 5.0% respectively. Data are weighted for age, gender, geography and education based on a voter demographic model derived from historical voting patterns, but are not weighted by party registration or party identification.

The Survey Center continually studies the components that construct a poll, such as interview techniques, voter modeling, and collection methods, in order to refine its methodology and adjust to changes in voter and respondent behavior. This poll departs from the Center's standard use of live telephone interviews and implements an online collection methodology that has been under ongoing study and refinement. Comparison with previous Center polling, as this presentation explicitly does in its review of public figure favorability and job approval, should be evaluated in this context.

OVERVIEW:

New Hampshire Institute of Politics Executive Director Neil Levesque summarized the results, saying, "This poll focuses on how voter attitudes have been impacted by the emergence of COVID-19, or coronavirus, and the efforts of the Federal and New Hampshire governments to contain its spread and minimize the threat to public health. Overall, voters are supportive of the restrictions that have been implemented, are currently more concerned about protecting public health than the economy, and remain patient. There is, however, an expectation that restrictions will be lifted as we enter the summer months, as well as an understanding that continuing to restrict people from resuming their lives will eventually have an extremely significant impact on individuals and families.

"Underpinning voters' attitude about the response to the epidemic is the belief of 71% of respondents that public health concerns should take precedence over economic concerns, with only 18% dissenting from that view. Thus, while 73% report being significantly impacted by the response, 67% believe that the restrictions imposed in New Hampshire are just about right. When thinking of their own situation, 36 percent are more concerned about the potential health impact of the epidemic while 28% are more concerned about the potential economic impact. When thinking of the nation at large, 31% are more concerned about the economy while 29% are more concerned about public health. In a different sort of impact, 66% of parents with minors are concerned about the quality of education their children are receiving as schools remain shut down.

"38% of voters hope to see restrictions in New Hampshire lifted in May; however, only 18% expect that to happen, with a plurality (38%) believing restrictions will be lifted in June and an additional 23% over the remainder of the summer. Of the 76% of voters who do not yet report an extremely significant impact on their lives, 44% foresee reaching that point by the end of summer, and a total of 64% sometime this fall.

"The epidemic will have an impact on this fall's election, as 82% of voters say that leadership during this crisis will be an important factor in determining their votes. Governor Chris Sununu is earning deep bipartisan support for his leadership, with 86% of voters approving of his handling of the crisis versus just 13% that

disapprove. Support for the delegation's efforts falls closer to partisan lines, with 56% approving versus 36% disapproving. By contrast, President Donald Trump's leadership gets low marks from 58% of voters versus 42% approval. This tracks very closely with his overall favorability (42%/58%) and job approval (43%/57%), suggesting that his leadership style continues to be highly polarizing. In an early look at the election matchup between Trump and presumptive Democratic nominee Joe Biden, Biden opens with a 50%-42% advantage.

"Sununu's favorability (70%/28%) and job approval (74%/25%) have been buoyed by his leadership during the epidemic, and he is in a strong position to win re-election, with the caveat that periods of uncertainty and unexpected events can change voter attitudes precipitously. The members of the Congressional Delegation, which has played a less prominent though no less important role, have not received the same impact on their favorability and approval. Senator Jeanne Shaheen (55%/42% favorability) remains the most popular member of the delegation as she begins her re-election effort, followed by Senator Maggie Hassan (51%/43%), freshman Congressman Chris Pappas (49%/34%), and Congresswoman Annie Kuster (46%/40%). Shaheen has also earned the highest job approval (54%/40%), followed by Hassan (51%/39%), Pappas (48%/34%) and Kuster (44%/39%).

"In the face of an unprecedented crisis, New Hampshire's political leadership is acting in close accord with the priorities of those they serve, and their efforts to date enjoy the support of voters," concluded Levesque. "But more challenges lie ahead as the state begins to return to something approximating normalcy, and the fall elections are likely to be dominated by this issue."
