8-4-19 at approx. 0024 hours, I responded to Tybrisa Street with my emergency equipment activated after Sgt. LeGuin advised on the radio that he was in a chase. Officer Jessica Wright and I were a two officer unit responding with another officer in front of us. When We arrived on scene, I could see a large crowd of people scattered about both sides of the sidewalk and the street. I exited my patrol vehicle and saw people pointing to where Officer Sims and Sgt. LeGuin were. I saw Sims with a male under his control and Sgt. LeGuin securing a white female. I asked Sgt. LeGuin what he needed. He indicated to me that the woman wearing a long pink shirt needed to be arrested. I made contact with the female that was standing west of Officers by a parked vehicle. I advised her that she was under arrest and to put her hands behind her back. I immediately grabbed her right wrist and attempted to place it in a handcuff. She tensed her body and then turned around facing me. I was able to turn the female back around and then place her in handcuffs. They were double locked and sized to fit.

I walked her over to Officer K. Jaglinski's patrol car and attempted to place her in the backseat. I gave her several loud, clear verbal commands to get into the backseat. The female refused by continuing to make her body rigid and pushing away from the opening in the door. I continued with loud verbal commands for her to get in the backseat. She refused, yelling vulgarities and attracting the attention of uninvolved persons in the area. I advised the female that I did not want to hurt her by using force. She refused to comply. I then drew my department issued taser x2 and activated it. I again instructed her to get in the vehicle. Due to the size of the female (larger than the spacing in the door) and her unwillingness to cooperate, I attempted one last time to force her into the backseat using my left shoulder and pressing it into her body. At that time I saw the females upper body bend forward and felt her head meet the back left side of mine. Next I felt the female bite me twice on the back of my head just above the left ear. I immediately pulled away from the female and advised Officer Jaglinski (who was on the other side of the backseat) that she bit me and to pull her across the seat. This attempt was unsuccessful and her upper body began to slide out of the backseat towards me again.

I picked the female up and placed her back in the backseat and had Officer Jaglinski come to me instructing her to make sure the female's upper body doesn't come out of the backseat again. I went to the other side of the car and pulled her upper body through. At that time the female began to spread her legs to the interior walls of the backseat making them rigid so that her upper body couldn't be pushed into a seated position. All the while I gave clear verbal commands, switching to a more calm, and lower volumed tone of voice in an attempt to gain compliance. This tactic also failed. I explained to the female that we did not want to hurt her. It was obvious that the crowd surrounding us was still hostile and growing in numbers. Knowing that there were no other officers to call for man power assistance and that we needed to get the female loaded and out of the area, I again activated my taser (which was dropped under the car just before she bit me. It was later returned to me by another officer) explaining that I was going to taze her if she didn't comply. She responded "do what you have to do bitch". I then applied one drive stun technique to her back between her shoulder blades. The contact was brief as she continued to move around. I activated the arc switch again attempting another drive stun in the same area. Again, she moved around which moved the contact points to different places in the immediate area of her skin. After giving more commands for her to put her legs into the car, she refused. I applied a third and unsuccessful drive stun attempt to the female's hip area. None of the cycles that were applied appeared to be full five second durations.

After these attempts didn't work, we tried other tactics in an attempt to avoid further uses of force. We tried other officers speaking with her attempting to gain compliance, as well as letting her husband try to calm her and talk her into the car. The female was restrained and partially in the backseat but do to her size (width and length) she was difficult to control. None of these tactics were successful, she maintained her disorderly behavior by continuously yelling vulgarities and refusing to comply with commands to include physically resisting. I was holding support under the females upper body partially so that she wouldn't injure her head, neck or shoulders while resisting. While doing this, I felt her muscles relax an quickly sat her up placing her all the way in the vehicle in a seated and upright position. Immediately upon her being placed in the patrol car, I exited the backseat and closed the

door. She was then transported to the Tybee Jail by Officer Jaglinski. Officer Wright and I returned to my patrol vehicle and went to the Tybee Jail to aid with the processing. Before leaving the scene Sgt. LeGuin advised me that he and Officer Sims were injured as a result of the fighting with their suspects. See their reports for further information. EMS was called and responded to the jail. I spoke with the female that I arrested while she was still in the back seat of Officer Jaglinski's patrol car. I asked her for her information to which she first refused but later identified herself as Alecia Adams. I met with EMS and advised them of what needed to be checked on Adams as she was tazed. I providing them with the details of what occurred. When I opened the back passenger door, the female was laying on her right side and vomiting in the right rear floor board. I could see that she vomited all down the rear driver's side door as well. Adams was breathing rapidly and coughing/gagging. EMS was present for this and observing. After Adams was done being sick, she exited the patrol car and was brought inside the jail. EMS checked her out based on the information I provided. Adams requested an EKG stating she has heart problems. EMS provided the EKG and completed the medical evaluation and expressed no concerns for her health requiring further treatment.

Adams was given a second set of handcuffs while in the jail to provide more room for her shoulders due to her size. They were double locked and sized to fit. Adams was placed in a cell by herself with the handcuffs still on. A short time after EMS cleared from the jail, Officer Wright who was helping with the booking process of the arrestees called and requested EMS again for Adams. Hearing this, I responded to the jail and made contact with Adams. After speaking with her in the cell, it was found that there was a misunderstanding. She did not need EMS but to go to the bathroom and couldn't because of the handcuffs. I canceled EMS and removed the restraints from Adams. We spoke briefly about her needing to calm down so that we could complete the paperwork necessary to transport her to the Chatham County Detention Center. She agreed. During this time more fight calls were being dispatched causing me to leave the jail and respond to it and other calls for service due to manpower constraints. The initial attempts to photograph the locations of the taser contacts was unsuccessful due to her demeanor.

EMS checked my head where I felt Adams bite me. They advised that they could see where she made contact with my head as there were scrapes.

Adams was charged with:

- Public Intoxication
- Disorderly Conduct
- Obstruction by resisting
- Felony obstruction by offering violence

Adams was provided with an arraignment waiver which she signed and agreed to . All other necessary paperwork was completed and taken to the jail.
