

Dear fellow Nebraskans,

We, the LGBTQIA+ Student Organizations of the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, are appalled by the Clery Reportable Hate Crime that took place on our campus this past weekend.

First and foremost, we want to express our solidarity and support for those impacted. Hate has no place at UNL, and no student should have to live in fear of being harassed or assaulted.

In 2021, we celebrated 50 years of LGBTQIA+ studies at UNL. Our community is not going anywhere. Our students, faculty, staff, and community members deserve to feel safe and supported. Despite many who may believe that discrimination and hatred are a thing of the past, that everyone is valued fairly and equally, and that there is nothing left to fight for, this event is proof that we—as a Nebraska community—have many more steps that must be taken before we can assert ourselves as a campus that welcomes all.

In times like this, it is vital that we create a community that supports each other. While we cannot directly change the opinions of those who hold prejudice and hate, we have the ability to find consolation in one another. Resilience is built on trust, community, and the motto that the University of Nebraska-Lincoln stands for: in our grit, our glory. It is sad to say that the grit required has to go towards standing against hatred. Every person and every interaction matters, and that includes every identity present on our campus. We want to make it clear that everyone's safety, well-being, and community matters.

We are disappointed in the lackluster response of the university in advocating for the LGBTQIA+ community on campus and urge that leaders in the University of Nebraska System stand in solidarity with us. We call on the university's leadership to take action—not just words, but tangible steps and acknowledgment to ensure the safety and well-being of LGBTQIA+ students. A lackluster response is unacceptable. Students cannot thrive in an environment where they feel unsafe or unsupported. Students who do not feel safe will spend more time in fear and isolation and less time towards their studies and applying themselves to their fullest potential. Every student should have the same ability to succeed.

In these difficult times, community is more important than ever. We want our community to know that we, the LGBTQIA+ student organizations, strive to provide safe spaces. We encourage students, faculty, staff, and community members to stand up against hate. While we cannot change the minds of those who choose hate, we can choose to uplift, protect, and support one another.

To every LGBTQIA+ student feeling fearful: We are here for you. You are supported, and there are people who care about you. We will fight for a campus community that values your safety and rights. We wish to ensure that students, faculty, and all those affected maintain hope and continue to strive for a better tomorrow. It is now more crucial than ever for us to come together and stand united as a community against the hate that is ever present in our world. Stay strong.
