Additionally, should Ms. Wade's behavior escalate or should she re-enter the building for the purposes of protesting, our office will reconsider the merits of this case and determine the best course of action in addressing the above.

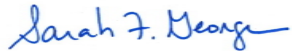

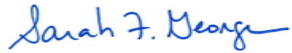
